 Written Comments: The Council will continue to take general public comment and comment on the meeting's specific agenda items in written form via email through 1:00 pm on Wednesday, September 9. Web form submission for written public comment can be found at https://www.cabq.gov/sept-9-2020-written. These comments will be distributed to all Councilors for review in advance of the meeting.

- Virtual, Live Comments: The Council will take general public comment on any topic, including agenda items, from up to a maximum of 15 people, on a first-come first-serve basis. To provide real time verbal public comment over Zoom, participants must sign up for public comment by 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 9. The sign-up sheet can be accessed at this link: https://www.cabq.gov/sept-9-2020-live
- o Note: Participants must sign up for public comment with the Zoom username or phone number that you will use to enter the Zoom meeting so that you can be identified when accessing the meeting. Persons who do not provide this information will not be allowed into the meeting, but may still view the meeting via the YouTube live link or through GOVTV.
- Participants will standby in the Zoom virtual waiting room until the public comment period begins. The Zoom moderator will move all participants who have signed up for comment into the meeting room at that time.
