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### ORDINANCE

2 AMENDING CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 9, ROA 1994, REGARDING PUBLIC 3 IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS, TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF 4 CANDIDATE ELECTION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR PUBLIC 5 IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 7 ALBUQUERQUE:

8 Section 1. FINDINGS. The Council finds:

9 (A) In 2003, the City adopted certain Public Improvement District ("PID") 10 Policy Guidelines and Application Procedures (the "PID Ordinance") in 11 relation to the Public Improvement District Act, Sections 5-11-1 through 27, 12 NMSA 1978, as amended (the "Act"), enacted by the New Mexico Legislature in 13 2001.

(B) Pursuant to Section 5-11-6 of the Act, a PID, upon formation, is governed by a board consisting of members of the governing body, ex officio or, upon determination of the governing body, five directors appointed by the governing body.

18 (C) Pursuant to Section 5-11-9(A) of the Act, three members of an 19 appointed board of directors are to serve initial terms of six years and two of 20 the members are to serve initial terms of four years, and if a vacancy occurs 21 on the PID board because of death, resignation or inability of the director to 22 discharge the duties of director, the City shall appoint a director to fill the 23 vacancy, who shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term until a 24 successor is appointed or elected. 1 (D) Pursuant to Sections 5-11-2(F) and 5-11-9(C) of the Act, at the end of 2 the terms of the appointed directors of a PID, the longest of which is six years 3 after the date of the formation of the PID, the governing body is to hold an 4 election of new directors by majority vote of the qualified electors and owners 5 in the PID.

6 (E) Pursuant to Section 5-11-2(G) of the Act, elections under the Act are to 7 be held in compliance with Sections 5-11-6 and 5-11-7 of the Act.

8 (F) Sections 5-11-7(B) and (F) of the Act provide that either a PID board or 9 the governing body (which for purposes of the Act is the City) may establish 10 provisions for voting by mail and for the returns of the election to be made in 11 person or by mail.

(G) Except as provided in Section 5-11-7 of the Act, elections pertaining to
a PID are to be held in compliance with the general election laws of the State
of New Mexico.

(H) In order to establish (1) a uniform policy for all PIDs within the City, (2)
procedures by which an election of new directors shall be held, and (3)
provisions for voting by mail and the returns of elections, the PID Ordinance is
hereby amended to include provisions for the administration of elections of
PID board directors.

Section 2. Section 6-9-1(E) ROA 1994, GENERAL POLICIES, is amended to read:

"(E) The PID shall be governed by a Board of Directors appointed or elected pursuant to Sections 5-11-1 et seq. NMSA ("the Act"). If the City Council is serving as the PID Board, the City Council may, in accordance with law, delegate certain responsibilities of governance of the PID to a committee as approved by the City Council. Advisory committees may, at the option of the PID Board, be utilized."

8 Section 3. Chapter 6, Article 9 ROA 1994 is amended by inserting the 9 following new section:

30 § 6-9-7 PID BOARD ELECTION PROCEDURES.

31 (A) Delegation of Election Administration to PID Board. It is the policy of
32 the City that all elections of PID board members held pursuant to Section 5-1133 7 NMSA 1978 shall be conducted pursuant to the provisions of this section on

1 behalf of the governing body of the City, and the responsibility for the conduct 2 and administration of certain aspects of such board elections pursuant to the provisions of this policy shall be delegated to the board of directors of each 3 4 PID formed by the City.

5 (1) After a PID is organized and the first board is appointed, the PID 6 board shall govern the conduct of all subsequent regular and special elections 7 of the PID, determine when all subsequent regular and special elections of the 8 special district are to be held, may consult with and obtain guidance and 9 assistance from the City Clerk concerning the conduct of such elections, and 10 shall act as the canvassing board for the purpose of interpreting procedures 11 and deciding controversies or other matters arising in the conduct of the 12 elections.

13 (2) All powers and authority delegated to the board pertaining to the 14 conduct of regular or special elections may be exercised in the absence of the 15 board by the secretary or by an assistant secretary appointed by the board. 16 The person named by the board who is responsible for the conducting of the 17 election shall be the designated election official.

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(B) Call for Nominations.

(1) Not less than 70 days nor more than 90 days before a regular special district election, the designated election official shall provide notice of a call for nominations for the election and such notice shall be posted in at least three (3) public places within the PID and shall be published in full, in English and Spanish, once a week for at least two (2) consecutive weeks before the 45<sup>th</sup> day prior to the election in the *Albuquerque Journal* or another newspaper of general circulation within the PID. The call shall state the date of the election, the number of PID directors to be voted upon at the election, where a self-nomination and acceptance form may be obtained, the deadline for submitting the self-nomination and acceptance form to the designated election official, information on obtaining a ballot if the election will be by 30 mail-ballot only, the name and address of the designated election official, and 31 a brief summary of the information described in subsection (B)(2) of this 32 Section.

1 (2) The call for nominations shall include either (i) a summary of the 2 basic annual and periodic responsibilities of the PID board, including items (a) 3 through (e), or (ii) the method by which interested persons may obtain the 4 summary. Annual and periodic board responsibilities include:

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(a) Adoption of an open meetings resolution;

6 (b) Preliminary and final approval of an annual budget sufficient 7 to pay debt service on outstanding district bonds and annual administrative 8 costs;

(c) Exercise of remedies to collect delinquent PID special levies;

(d) Approval of audited financial statements; and

11 (e) Approval of continuing disclosure reports prepared on behalf12 of the PID.

(3) The designated election official shall provide the information
described in subsection (B)(2) of this Section promptly to all persons
accepting nominations for board positions, including self-nominated
candidates as provided in Section (C) below.

(C) Self-Nomination.

(1) Not less than 60 days before the date of the election, any person who desires to be a candidate for the office of a PID director shall file a selfnomination and acceptance form or letter signed by the candidate and by a registered elector as a witness to the signature of the candidate.

(2) On the date of signing the self-nomination and acceptance form or letter, the candidate for director shall be a resident of the State eligible under State law to vote in statewide elections.

(3) A self-nomination and acceptance form that is not sufficient may be amended once at any time prior to 3 p.m. on the 30<sup>th</sup> day before the election.

(4) The self-nomination and acceptance form or letter shall state the name of the PID in which the election will be held, the date of the election, the full name of the candidate as it is to appear on the ballot, and a statement that the candidate is a resident of the State eligible under State law to vote in statewide elections. Unless physically unable, all candidates and witnesses shall sign their own signature and shall print their names, their respective residence addresses, including the street number and name, the city or town, the county, telephone number, and the date of signature on the self nomination and acceptance form or letter.

3 (5) The self-nomination and acceptance form or letter shall be filed with 4 the designated election official of the PID in which the election will be held, and the designated election official shall verify the sufficiency of the 5 6 information contained therein and shall return any insufficient self-nomination 7 form to the candidate with a written description of the insufficiency. The 8 candidate shall have three (3) days from the date of mailing or other delivery 9 by the designated election official of notice of insufficiency to submit a 10 corrected self-nomination and acceptance form or letter.

11 (6) The Governing Body, at its option, may nominate one or more 12 candidates, each of whom shall be a resident of the State eligible under State 13 law to vote in statewide elections. The Governing Body or its designee shall 14 provide a list of any candidate(s) nominated by the Governing Body to the 15 designated election official of the PID in which the election will be held not 16 less than 60 days before the date of the election. The Governing Body shall 17 have no duty to nominate any candidate.

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(D) Time for Holding Elections; Manner of Election; Notice.

(1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (D)(2) of this section, regular PID elections shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May in every other even-numbered year.

(2) Special elections may be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February, May, October, or December, but in no event on a date within 42 days before any statewide election, as provided by Section 1-12-71 NMSA 1978.

(3) At least 60 days prior to a PID Board election, the designated
election official or the City Clerk shall request that the County Clerk provide to
both the City Clerk and the designated election official a list of the names and
addresses of registered electors of the county who are also registered
electors of the PID.

31 (4) At least 60 days prior to a PID Board election, the designated
32 election official or the City Clerk shall request that the County Assessor
33 provide to both the City Clerk and the designated election official a list of the

1 names and addresses of the owners of real property in the district on the 2 current property tax assessment roll.

3 The designated election official shall prepare a voter list of (5) 4 registered electors residing within the PID and owners of property within the 5 PID from the lists provided by the County Clerk and County Assessor.

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(6) The designated election official shall prepare and provide to the City Clerk a form of ballot containing the names of the eligible candidates.

8 (7) In the event of a mail ballot only election, the following procedures 9 shall be followed:

10 (a) The designated election official or the City Clerk shall make 11 available at the Office of the City Clerk beginning no later than 20 days before 12 the date of the election a regular ballot to any person whose name appears on 13 the voter list or who provides an affidavit of ownership signed by that person. 14 The designated election official or the City Clerk shall record the names and mailing addresses of each person receiving a regular ballot. 15

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(b) The designated election official or the City Clerk shall make 17 available at the Office of the City Clerk a provisional ballot to any person not 18 appearing on the voter list, but claiming eligibility to vote as either a gualified 19 resident elector or as an owner of property within the PID. The designated 20 election official or the City Clerk shall record the name and mailing address of 21 any person to whom a provisional ballot is given, and shall keep copies of any 22 evidence presented by such person in support of the claim of eligibility. If 23 during the canvass the PID Board determines it has insufficient information to 24 determine whether a person given a provisional ballot is a qualified elector, it 25 shall provide written notification to such person that he or she may present 26 additional evidence of eligibility to the PID Board, and shall describe the 27 means by which such evidence may be presented and that the evidence must 28 be presented before the end of the canvassing period of 30 days, as provided 29 in Section 5-11-7(G) NMSA 1978.

30 (c) Ballots shall be available to prospective electors at the Office of 31 the City Clerk, or, upon written request, shall be mailed or e-mailed to the 32 requesting person, until the close of business on the Friday immediately 33 preceding the date of the election.

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1 (8) At least one polling place shall be provided for a PID board election 2 that is not a mail ballot only election. The designated election official shall 3 select the most convenient and suitable public building or public school 4 building within the PID that can be obtained. If no public building or public school building is available, the designated election official shall provide 5 6 some other suitable place, which shall be the most convenient and 7 appropriate place obtainable within or near the PID, considering the purpose 8 for which it is to be used.

9 (E) Voter Eligibility.

10 (1) No person shall be permitted to vote in any election unless that
11 person is a registered qualified elector or property owner as defined in section
12 5-11-3 NMSA 1978.

(2) Each voter may cast one vote per candidate for up to five (5)
candidates. As provided in Section 5-11-7 NMSA 1978, a property owner who
is also a qualified resident elector shall not be entitled to an additional vote as
a result of residing within the PID.

(3) Any person desiring to vote at any election as a registered qualified
elector or property owner shall sign an affidavit that the person is an elector of
the PID. The affidavit shall be on a form that contains in substance the
following:

9 (F) *Notice of Election.* Pursuant to Section 5-11-7(A) NMSA 1978, a notice of 10 election shall be posted in at least three (3) public places within the PID not 11 less than 20 days before the election and shall be published in full, in English 12 and Spanish, once a week for at least two (2) consecutive weeks before the 13 election in the *Albuquerque Journal* or another newspaper of general 14 circulation within the PID. The notice shall indicate the following:

(1) Ballots may be obtained at the Office of the designated election
official City Clerk or, upon written request received not later than the close of
business on the Friday immediately preceding the election, will be mailed or emailed to the requesting person.

(2) Each elector may cast one vote per candidate for up to five (5) candidates listed on the ballot.

(3) Ballots may be returned to the Office of the City Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the date of the election. Mail-in ballots must be received in the Office of the City Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on the date of the election.

(4) If voting will be in-person, the hours during the day, not less than six, in which the polls will be open.

(G) Form of Ballot; Voting and Canvassing Results.

(1) The designated election official or the City Clerk will make ballots available to prospective voters at the Office of the City Clerk. In addition, upon request, the designated election official or the City Clerk shall mail or e-mail a ballot to requesting persons upon the presentation of a title report or other evidence establishing ownership of property within the PID, or the presentation of evidence establishing that the person is eligible to vote under the PID Act (i.e. the voter is a resident qualified elector who resides within the 1 boundaries of the PID and is gualified to vote in general elections held in the 2 state pursuant to Section 1-1-4 NMSA 1978). Property owners who do not live 3 within the PID (but who would like to vote in the Election) must execute an 4 affidavit stating that they are the owner of land in the PID. Completed ballots, if 5 delivered by hand, must be received by 5:00 p.m. on the date of the election at 6 the office of the PID; and if delivered by U.S. Mail, must be postmarked on or 7 before 5:00 p.m. on the date of the election. The form of ballot shall contain in 8 substance the following:

5 (2) The place for the receipt of completed ballots for the Election shall
6 be the Office of the City Clerk, 600 2nd NW, 7th floor, Albuquerque, New
7 Mexico, 87102.

8 (3) Completed ballots, if delivered by hand, must be received by 5:00
9 p.m. on \_\_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_ at the Office of the City Clerk; and if delivered by U.S.
10 Mail, must be received in the Office of the City Clerk before 5:00 p.m. on \_\_\_\_\_

(4) The \_\_\_\_ candidates receiving the most votes, as evidenced by the
certificate of canvassing prepared by the designated election official or the
City Clerk, will be elected as the new members of the PID board.

15 (5) The ballots are expected to be counted and the results tallied in the 16 Office of the City Clerk, 600 2nd NW, 7th floor, Albuquerque, New Mexico, 17 87102 on \_\_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_ at 3:00 p.m. In any event, canvassing shall be 18 completed within thirty (30) days of the Election and the designated election 19 official or the City Clerk shall prepare a certificate of canvassing for recording 20 in the PID board's minute book by the PID Clerk, which certificate will indicate 21 the total number of votes cast, the total number of votes cast for each 22 candidate, and will specify which five candidates received the most votes.

(H) *Transfer of Property Title to Qualify Electors.* No person shall take or place any interest in title to taxable property in the name of another, whether a fractional undivided interest or otherwise, or enter into a contract to purchase or sell taxable property, for the purpose of attempting to influence the outcome of any PID election. Any ballot cast in violation of this subsection as determined in an election contest conducted pursuant to Section 1-14-1 et seq. NMSA 1978, shall be void.

30 (I) Board Member Terms. All PID board members shall have four (4) year31 terms.

(J) *Quorum*. A majority of the number of director positions filled at the time
 of a PID board meeting shall constitute a quorum for the carrying out of PID
 board duties.

4 (K) *Definitions*. The terms defined in Section 5-11-2 NMSA 1978 shall have
5 the same meaning when used herein unless otherwise indicated.

6 (L) Further Authorization. The City Clerk, the Chairperson of the PID board 7 and the PID Clerk of a PID are authorized and directed to take all action 8 necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Section 6-9-7. The 9 PID Clerk shall consult with and seek the assistance of the City Clerk as he or 10 she deems necessary or convenient, but is authorized and directed to take any 11 and all steps necessary for the proper conduct of the election, including 12 giving timely notice of the election by proclamation by publication and posting 13 thereof and compliance with the Federal Voting Rights Act and any other 14 matters of federal or state election law.

15 Section 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 16 clause, word, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid 17 or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall 18 not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The 19 Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each 20 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word, or phrase thereof irrespective of 21 any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

Section 5. COMPILATION. Sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance shall be incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.

Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after publication by title and general summary.

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
