**1. On page 3, line 26 amend as follows:
Provider ~~[Infrastructure Grant]~~ Program**

2. Beginning on page 4, line 3, amend as follows:

Provider ~~[Infrastructure Grant]~~ Program 10,000,000

These funds are designated to establish a competitive grant process to fund shovel-ready capital projects ~~[and services]~~ for nonprofit service providers, prioritizing facility expansion and infrastructure improvements that enhance the capacity and sustainability of opioid-related treatment, harm reduction, and recovery services; and requiring that the grant program be jointly managed by the City of Albuquerque and Bernalillo County to ensure a coordinated, equitable, and efficient funding process, and avoid duplication.

Explanation: This amendment strikes the words infrastructure grant from the Provider Program. It also adds services to the projects available to receive grant funding. This broadens the scope of projects that can be funded by the grant program.

1. On page 3, line 20, amend SECTION 2 as follows:

SECTION 2. The Joint Opioid Settlement Implementation Plan is hereby adopted by the City of Albuquerque and shall govern the use of Opioid Settlement Funds in conjunction with the provisions of R-23-174, *Establishing a Policy for the Expenditure of Opioid Settlement Monies*. This Implementation Plan is attached hereto as Attachment 2. [The recurring funding limitations set forth in Section 11 of the Implementation Plan shall not apply during FY26.]
