1. Beginning on page 2, line 1, amend subsection (A) as follows:

**(A) ~~[A seven-member City Charter Review Task Force shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council]~~ [A City Charter Review Task Force consisting of 11 members is hereby created] to review and evaluate all areas of the City Charter, including those sections which have been challenged as well as the unchallenged sections. [The Task Force shall be made up of the following 11 members: one member selected by each City Councilor; one at-large member selected by the City Council who shall chair the Task Force; and one member appointed by the Mayor.] The Task Force shall be a blue ribbon group, whose members are well respected in the community. Among the members shall be citizens who are knowledgeable as to municipal government organization in Albuquerque and/or in general. Membership shall include attorneys respected in the area of municipal and constitutional law.**

Explanation: This amendment proposes to change the composition of the Charter Review Task force from 7 members appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council to 11 members. Each City Councilor would select a member, the Council would collectively select a chair, and the Mayor would appoint one member.
