Committee Composition & Voting Procedures

- 9 Members 9 Alternates
- Alternates may participate in all meetings of the Committee
- BUT may not vote unless the Committee member is absent at the time of the vote



Committee Composition & Voting Procedures

Adoption of regular motions:

Majority of members present

Adoption of final recommendations to City Council:

Majority of all members (at least 5 of 9)

Minority Voting Rights

What does it mean?

Non-dilution of voting strength

Opportunity to elect a candidate of choice

No packing/cracking





Minority Voting Rights



Who does it cover?

Ethnic/language minorities (VRA)

Must meet *Gingles* factors *Thornburg v. Gingles, 478 U.S. 30 (1986)*

- Compact and large enough to reach majority
- Politically cohesive
- Bloc voting by white population





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




Communities of Interest

A group/area with shared characteristics

e.g. neighborhoods, language, history, economics, lived experiences


Compactness



- Be contiguous
- Be relatively compact with as few geographic extremes as possible
- Attempt to preserve communities of interest
- Adhere to existing precinct lines, except where divided by municipal boundaries
- **Follow Constitutional** principles governing voting rights (VRA)




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Districts shall:

- Be contiguous
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- **Follow Constitutional** principles governing voting rights (VRA)

Districts may:

- Preserve the core of existing districts
- Consider the residence of incumbents



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- Be contiguous
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Districts may:

- Preserve the core of existing districts
- Consider the residence of incumbents

Districts shall not:

Use partisan election data or registration data in designing plans







Ideal district population: 62,727




Cumulative Deviations West and East of River


