Towards a More Walkable Albuquerque



Jeff Speck is a city planner who advocates for smart growth and sustainable design. As the former director of design at the National Endowment for the Arts, he oversaw the Mayors' Institute on City Design, where he worked with dozens of American mayors on their most pressing city planning challenges. He leads a design practice based in Washington, D.C.

Speck was coauthor of the landmark bestseller *Suburban Nation* and authored the acclaimed *Walkable City: How Downtown Can Save America, One Step at a Time*. He has dedicated his career to determining what makes cities thrive and has boiled it down to one key factor: walkability.
