Crash rates for teens are highest during the first six months and 1,000 miles after they are licensed. "CRASH" is a comprehensive media campaign to help youths and parents throughout New Mexico understand the dangers associated with distracted driving, and to give them specific tools and suggestions for lessening the chance of a crash. The project includes a broadcast documentary, live follow up TV program, a viewer guide, and a town hall meeting guide for youth. This will be an opportunity for youths and their parents to come together and help make each other safer drivers—and save lives.

The hook to the campaign is hearing and seeing real stories from people who have been involved in a crash. It also focuses on the reasons why distracted driving (intoxication, cell phone use, eating, additional passengers) causes crashes. The program will also highlight the most recent research involving cell phone use, DWI and other causes of crashes, focusing on the extremely high number of distracted driving crashes, especially for young people. The campaign also includes basic information about the Graduated Drivers License and its effectiveness in reducing teen crashes, as well as highlighting the various reasons that young drivers are at risk for having a car crash. CLOSING MAY 4TH; AFRICAN AMERICAN ART FROM THE PERMANENT COLLECTION

This small installation in the Works on Paper gallery features drawings, prints, photographs, and paintings by African American artists who live in New Mexico, or have been inspired by the region. The diverse assembly include rarely exhibited treasures from the collection such as prints by Albuquerque-based Rhein Whit-Pritchett, a monumental drawing by Santa Fe based Ron Adams, and a memory painting by Albuquerque artist Reginald Gammon. The installation will also feature recent acquisitions including an image from the series "Blacks in the West" by Los Angeles based photographer Tony Gleaton.

CLOSING MAY 18TH; BEHIND CLOSED DOORS: ART IN THE SPANISH AMERICAN HOME 1492-1898

Behind Closed Doors explores the private lives and interiors of Spain's New World elite from 1492 through the nineteenth century, focusing on the house as a principal repository of fine and decorative art.

Through approximately 160 paintings, sculptures, prints, textiles, and decorative art objects, this exhibition presents for the first time American, European, and Asian luxury goods from everyday life as signifiers of the faith, wealth, taste, and socio-racial standing of their consumers.

The exhibition explores themes including representations of the indigenous and Creole elite, rituals in the home, the sala de estrado (women's sitting room), the bedchamber, and social identity through material culture. *Behind Closed Doors* primarily consists of works from the Brooklyn Museum's world-renowned collections as well as exceptional loans from distinguished institutions and private collectors.

The exhibition is accompanied by a scholarly catalogue with contributions by leading scholars of Colonial Spanish and British American art. *Behind Closed Doors* is organized by Richard Aste, Curator of European Art, Brooklyn Museum.

EVERYBODY'S NEIGHBOR: VIVIAN VANCE

This exhibition celebrates the life and times of one of Albuquerque's most famous residents, the late Vivian Vance, of *I Love Lucy* fame, through family memorabilia and the museum's Photoarchives. Open through January 31, 2015

Permanent Exhibition (East Gallery)

A permanent art exhibition highlighting a significant and museum-owned works from the late 19th century to the present day, including some that have never before been viewed by the public.

Balloon Museum

CHILDREN OF WAR, VOICES FOR PEACE

Back by popular demand, this touching exhibition features a little-known footnote in the history of World War II. Japanese schoolchildren were recruited to help create "Fugos"—giant balloons that were armed with bombs and launched across the Pacific.

The only enemy-caused deaths on the North American continent in World War II occurred from the detonation of one of these bombs. The exhibition features the story of one Japanese schoolgirl who later learned that her contribution to her country's safety was an instrument of death, and of her subsequent efforts to promote peace.

CHILDREN'S PEACE STATUE

This statue was dedicated at the Balloon Museum August 4, 2013. The Children's Peace Statue is a monument designed and funded entirely by children. It stands as a symbol of hope for a peaceful future. In the fall of 1989, children of Arroyo del Oso Elementary School in Albuquerque, New Mexico were studying the Arms Race. The children decided that one solution to the problem of war would be to teach young people to work for peace. During their studies, the students learned the story of school children in Japan who built a monument, the Genbaku No Ko No Zo Statue for Children Who Were Victims of the Atomic Bombs. Inspired by the story, the children formed the Kids' Committee for the Children's Peace Statue and made plans to design and build a peace monument of their own.

FAI BALLOONING COMMISSION INTERNATIONAL HALL OF FAME

The Hall of Fame features some 40 existing inductees and recognizes people who have made significant contributions to aerostation. In a private induction ceremony for media and invited guests on September 30, 2011, the following were inducted into the Hall of Fame: Ron Clark, a member of the crew to make the first balloon crossing of the Pacific Ocean; Larry Newman, a co-inventor of the ultra-light airplane and co-captain on the first manned balloon crossing of the Pacific Ocean; Rocky Aoki, a restaurateur and a record-setting balloonist in crossing the Pacific Ocean in a helium balloon; and Olivier Roux Devillas, the founder of the French Aeronautical Federation and competitive balloonist. Past inductees with a New Mexico connection include Sid Cutter, the Balloon Fiesta co-founder, and Maxie Anderson and Ben Abruzzo, two of the three balloonists of the first trans-Atlantic balloon flight.

KiMo Theatre

This exhibition blends the experience of the senses in a most wonderful way.
