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
Safe Outdoor Spaces

- City Council understands and acknowledges the concerns regarding Safe Outdoor Spaces
- The Safe Outdoor Space recently approved is located west of I-25, outside the Menaul MRA boundary
- MRA Plans cannot change zoning
- Safe Outdoor Spaces are an allowed use in certain zones
- The purpose of the meeting tonight is to discuss the MRA and the vision for redevelopment and recommendation to achieve that vision

- ✓ SWOT Analysis
- Findings and Recommendations



- Designation of MRA within subarea
- Three Opportunity Sites
 - ✓ Northeast corner of Menaul and Vassar Drive
 - South side of Menaul between University Boulevard and Fairfield Drive
 - Southeast corner of Claremont Avenue and Richmond Drive (outside the MRA boundary)

- Public Safety Improvements
 - APD Substation (could be APD or Albuquerque Community Safety or a combination)
 - Overhead mobile cameras at key intersections
 - Code Blue stations along trails and other areas
 - Regular field briefings by APD
- Street Lighting Improvements
 - Cutler Avenue between Washington and San Mateo
 - Claremont Avenue between Vassar and University
 - Menaul Road, west of University
 - ✓ Bryn Mawr Drive, south of Menaul

Trail Improvements

- Lighting, cameras, and Code Blue stations along the North Diversion Channel Trail
- Establishing a trail sponsorship program for maintenance

Installation of trail markers/wayfinding signage


Transit Improvements

- Increase frequency of cleaning bus shelters
- Promotion of Adopt-a-Stop Program
- Remove benches and replace with shelter
- Remove windscreens of existing shelters
- Exploring other bench designs

- Landscaping & Wayfinding Improvements
 - East side of East Frontage Road from south of Menaul to Candelaria
 - East side of East Frontage Road from the truck stop to Candelaria
 - North side of I-40 right-of-way from Exit 159D to University
- Building & Sidewalk Improvements
 - Along Menaul Boulevard from Morningside east to San Mateo and north to Candelaria
 - Evaluation of public sidewalks along Menaul and San Mateo

MRA Designation

- Subarea within the Phase 1 study area
- Boundaries are Phoenix Avenue (north), I-40 (south), North Diversion Channel (east), and I-25 (west)
- ADC recommended approval of designation in February
- Approved by City Council in April




• Deterioration of site improvements

New Recommendations Since Phase 1

- Visitor Center in proximity to hotel area at University and Menaul Boulevards
- Orphan signs venue for public art
- Dog park near Applebees
- Traffic calming along Menaul Boulevard
- Potential north-south Bus Rapid Transit Route provides opportunity for mixed-use development
