
City of Albuquerque October 4, 2011 Municipal Election



Abbreviated Unofficial Election Calendar

Election Day: October 4, 2011

- Day is the 1st Tuesday after the 1st Monday in October of odd-numbered years
- Municipal Elections in Albuquerque are regulated by New Mexico law, the Albuquerque City Charter and the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque
- Even-numbered districts
 will elect their city
 councilors on Election
 Day, plus any bond or
 City Charter
 Amendments that are
 presented
- Working backwards, the deadlines required by the controlling laws begin in March 2011

Open and Ethical Elections Code City Charter Article XVI

- Charter Article controls public financing
- Requires potential city council candidates focus upon the area of the city that encompasses the district in which the potential candidate wishes to represent
- Exploratory Period allows potential candidates to receive seed money and in-kind contributions from individuals within and outside of the candidate's council district
- Exploratory period begins
 Tuesday, March 15, 2011

Qualifying Period: OEEC

- Begins Sunday, May 1, 2011
- Applicant Candidates can only accept contributions from registered voters from within the district they wish to represent
- If redistricting is not complete by this time, candidates cannot accurately collect funds and potentially harm their ability to qualify for public funding

Other issues

- Certification of Applicant Candidates as Participating Candidates requires prior notification to County Clerk for reprogramming of districts
- Awaiting timeline required by programmers to provide Committee

■ April 30: Exploratory Period Ends

■ May 1: Qualifying Period Begins

First day for candidates to obtain signatures for

Petitions. City Council candidates must obtain

signatures of 500 registered voters in the district the

candidate seeks to represent

May 31: Qualifying Period Ends

■ June 1: Applicant Candidates for public financing are

certified as Participating Candidates and City Clerk

distributes funds to Participating Candidates

■ June 14: First day for City Council to adopt the election

resolution

■ June 28: Deadline for candidates to submit Petitions to City

Clerk

Deadline for City Council to adopt the election

resolution

August 9: Declaration of Candidacy

Due

■ August 11: Candidates appear in the

Office of the City Clerk to

determine certification of

candidacy

August 16: Deadline for withdrawal

of Candidacy

October 4: Election Day
