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Chairman's Perspective

Chairman's Perspective 2010 Annual Report

The Police Oversight Commission (POC) is an appointed body responsible for listening to complaints from members of the general public who feel they have been mistreated by the Albuquerque Police Department. A Citizens Police Complaint is received by the Independent Review Office (IRO), assigned to an investigator, and impartially investigated. If the citizen doesn't agree with the finding of the IRO they may appeal to the POC. On the appeal, the commissioners listen to the case as the complaintant presents his or her grievance, and then the investigation is presented by the IRO as well as the Police Department. The POC makes it decision based on the evidence presented and the decision is solely based on whether or not the Police violated Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

The POC recently overturned a decision by the IRO's office and that decision was appealed by the Chief of Police to the Chief Administrative Officer. The CAO read the issue and overruled the POC thus proving that the system as set up works in the best interest of the citizens of Albuquerque.

The IRO staff conducts thorough and professional investigations and is an asset to this community. As a part of the Police Oversight process in conjunction with his duties as Chief of Police, Chief Schultz has consistently taken appropriate corrective and disciplinary actions to insure that the citizens of Albuquerque will have a police department of the highest quality. We are privileged to serve our community on the Police Oversight Commission.

Executive Summary

Mission Statement

The mission of the Police Oversight Commission (POC) is to provide a means for prompt, impartial, and fair investigation of all citizen complaints brought by individuals against the Albuquerque Police Department (APD), and to provide for community participation in setting and reviewing police department policies, practices and procedures. William Deaton, the Independent Review Officer (IRO) works with the POC and APD to ensure that (1) citizen complaints are thoroughly investigated, (2) citizens have a fair opportunity to appeal the results, and (3) APD policies are changed to prevent the recurrence of problems identified through the complaint process.

Complaints Filed During 2010

There were 272 complaints filed in 2010.

Policy Reviews

The Long Term Planning Committee reviews all complaints where the IRO and the Chief disagree before the cases are heard by the full POC. The committee also reviews all IRO reports on police shootings and makes a recommendation to the POC.

INFORMATION CONCERNING THE PROCESS

I. Responsibilities of the POC and IRO

The purpose of the police oversight system is to provide a means for prompt, impartial, and fair investigation of all citizen complaints brought by individuals against the Albuquerque Police Department (APD), and to provide for community participation in setting and reviewing police department policies, practices and procedures.

The Police Oversight Commission

(POC) is composed of nine volunteers who broadly represent the diversity of the City. The POC has been charged to perform the following functions.

- 1. To promote a spirit of accountability and communication between the citizens and APD while improving community relations and enhancing public confidence.
- 2. To oversee the full investigation and/or mediation of all citizen complaints; audit and monitor all investigations and/or police shootings under investigation by APD's Internal Affairs (IA).
- **3.** To gain the cooperation of APD and solicit public input by holding regularly scheduled public meetings.

- **4.** To review all work of the Independent Review Office (IRO) with respect to quality, thoroughness, and impartiality of investigations.
- **5.** To submit periodic reports to the Mayor and City Council.
- **6.** To submit all findings to the Chief of Police.
- 7. To engage in a long-term planning process through which it identifies major problems and establishes a program of policy suggestions and studies each year.

The Long Term Planning Committee:

The Long Term Planning Committee (LTPC) of the POC consists of three commissioners and is chaired by Bambi Folk. These meetings are open to the public. The LTPC conducts detailed reviews of issues referred to them by the POC. **The Independent Review Officer,** William W. Deaton is an inactive attorney who manages the Independent Review Office and its staff. The IRO is given autonomy and performs the following duties under the direction of the POC.

- 1. The IRO receives all citizen complaints directed against APD and any of its officers. The IRO will review the citizen complaints and assign them to be investigated by IRO independent investigators or by Internal Affairs.
- 2. The IRO will oversee, monitor and review all of those investigations and make findings for each. These findings are reviewed by the chain of command of the Albuquerque Police Department and, if agreement is reached by the Chief of Police and the Independent Review Officer, forwarded to the POC for their approval. When there is no agreement between APD and the IRO, the matter is presented to the Police Oversight Commission as a "non-concurrence", and the Commission then makes its findings.
- **3.** The IRO makes recommendations and gives advice regarding APD policies and procedures to the POC, City Council, APD, and the Mayor.
- **4.** An impartial system of mediation may be used for certain complaints.
- **5.** The IRO monitors all claims of excessive force and police shootings and is an exofficio member of the Claims Review Board.
- **6.** The IRO ensures that all investigations are thorough, objective, fair, impartial, and free from political influence.
- **7.** The Independent Review Office maintains and compiles information sufficient to satisfy the POC's quarterly reporting requirements.
- **8.** The IRO and his/her staff shall play an active public role in the community and provide appropriate outreach to the community; publicizing the citizen complaint process and the locations within the community that are suitable for citizens to file complaints in a non-police environment.

II. Processing Complaints Against the Police

Any person may file a written complaint against APD or any of its officers. All complaints must be signed by the complainant as required by the union contract. These written complaints can be sent to:

- **d.** Internal Affairs, Albuquerque Police Department.

Complaint forms and the Ordinance establishing the POC and the IRO are available on the IRO website (see above). Complaint forms are also available at the IRO office, at City libraries, homeless shelters, police substations, and the Internal Affairs Unit of APD. The complaints may be filed with the city staff. All complaints will be forwarded to the IRO.

When the IRO receives a complaint, the complaint is entered into the IRO's case management database and assigned a unique Citizen Police Complaint (CPC) number. The IRO reviews the complaint and assigns the case to the IRO investigators or Internal Affairs. Upon completion of the investigation, the IRO reviews the investigation for thoroughness, impartiality, and fairness. The IRO will also consider and determine recommendations by the investigators as to which APD Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) the citizen alleged to be violated; and what are the appropriate findings and conclusions based on the evidence developed in the investigation. Findings are based on a preponderance of the evidence.

Definitions of complaint dispositions are as follows:

- **1. Sustained:** APD Member is determined to have committed the alleged violation.
- **2. Not Sustained:** It cannot be determined by a preponderance of the evidence whether the member did or did not commit the alleged violation.
- **3. Unfounded:** Member did not commit the alleged violation.
- **4. Exonerated:** Member was justified in taking the course of action alleged and/or member was operating with the guidelines of the law or SOPs.
- 5. Inactivated: Complaint was determined to not merit further investigation. Complaints can be inactivated for several reasons, including; failure to allege a violation of SOPs, submitting a complaint over 90 days after the incident, complaint is not against APD members, the APD member cannot be identified, or the case was successfully mediated.

*Mediation has been very successful. Chief Schultz formalized a mediation program. Lieutenant Jan Olstad is in charge of the mediation program. Five selected lieutenants and sergeants received mediation training. Mediated complaints are generally inactivated. Therefore, the number of inactivated complaints has increased substantially.

The IRO's findings are reviewed by the Police chain of command and then, if there is agreement between the Chief of Police and the IRO; sent to the Police Oversight Commission in the form of a Public Record Letter to be sent to the citizen. If the Chief of Police disagrees with the IRO's findings, the POC decides the matter after hearing both sides. A Public Record Letter stating the findings is then sent to the complainant by certified mail The Chief of Police has sole disciplinary authority over police department personnel.

If the citizen who filed the complaint is dissatisfied with the findings, he may appeal that decision to the POC. The appeal must be made within ten business days from the date the citizen receives the aforementioned public record letter from the IRO or POC. Appeals and non-concurrences are heard during the POC's monthly televised meetings which are open to the public. Upon appeal, the POC may adopt or change the findings and recommendations of the IRO and may make further recommendations to the Chief. If the citizen is still not satisfied with the action of the POC or the Chief of Police, the citizen may request a review by the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) within 10 business days.

This process is very transparent and it is subject to public scrutiny. The administration, city councilors, and citizens of Albuquerque have created a functioning and productive system of civilian oversight of the police department that they can be proud of. The passage of the amendments to the Police Oversight Ordinance in 2004 has improved the system. Our City Council has given us an ordinance which has put in place one of best operating oversight systems in the United States and it is unique to Albuquerque.

III. Timeliness of Investigating Citizen Complaints

In 2010 we have received 272 complaints. With our three investigators, the IRO office has investigated almost all complaints. A few complaints have been referred to Internal Affairs for investigation. The IRO sought extensions of time for investigation in fewer than 2% of the cases received during 2010.

IV. Sustained Allegations

In 2001, 53 complaints were sustained. 39 were sustained in 2002, while eighteen of those cases were sustained in the last three months of 2002. 49 complaints were Sustained from 2003 and 62 citizen complaints were sustained in 2004. Three police shooting investigations were sustained by the POC, but one was reversed on appeal by the CAO. In 2005, 68 citizen complaints and 8 police shootings have been sustained for procedural violations as of this report. In 2006, 73 complaints were sustained. In 2007, 89 complaints were sustained. In 2008, 48 complaints were sustained. In 2009, 55 complaints were sustained. In 2010, 95 complaints were sustained.

V. Public Outreach

In Second Quarter of 2010 the IRO office designed a pamphlet discussing the IRO and POC process.

A massive e-mail was sent to all Neighborhood Associations letting them know about the IRO/POC. An invitation was also attached for the IRO to present at their meetings.

IRO staff went to public library branches and distributed pamphlets and complaint forms.

A massive e-mail was sent to all APS High School Principals with an invitation for the IRO to present at their schools.

IRO pamphlets and complaint forms were delivered to the Islamic Center of New Mexico on Yale.

IRO staff went to community centers and senior centers and distributed pamphlets and complaint forms.

September 12, 2010 IRO presented at the Peppertree/Royal Oak Neighborhood association.

September 29, 2010 IRO staff presented at the School on Wheels Government/Civics Class.

October 28, 2010 IRO presented at the Academy Hills Park Neighborhood Association



The specific narrative of the Standard Operating Procedures implicated by the citizen complaints submitted this year are set forth in Part V of this Report. The following is a general description of the types of SOP violations alleged in the complaints. This general description is provided for informational purposes only. Because officer attitude and language are a frequent source of complaint, details of those types of complaints have been listed. Please note some allegations fall into more than one category, or there may be more than one allegation per case.







CPC Investigation Outcomes by Alleged SOP Violation



Summary of Citizen Complaint Annual Report-2010

The following is a list of Citizen Police Complaints (CPCs) submitted and reviewed during the year 2010. For each CPC there is listed a summary of the complaint as described by the citizen, the officer involved by numeric code, the implicated Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for each officer involved, the investigative finding, the IRO's review and Chief of Police's decision. The investigator is indicated as either the IRO or IA. The CPCs received this year are numbered 001-10 through 272-10 and are listed in Section A. Completed investigations are noted. Where the investigation has not been completed, the SOP and Finding indicate: "Pending". Where the investigation has been completed but not reviewed by the IRO, the IRO Review / Chief's Decision indicate: "Pending". Cases from the prior year, that were reviewed in the current year, are listed in Section B. The geographic location of each incident is indicated by APD Area Command, City Council District (after redistricting), and Neighborhood Association boundaries.

Part VI - Police Oversight Commission: Appeal Reviews of Citizen Police

Annual Report- 2010

This Part lists the appeals requested to be heard by the Police Oversight Commission (POC). Pursuant to § 9-4-1-9(A) of the Ordinance, citizens who were dissatisfied with the outcome of their complaint as contained in the dispositional letter from the Chief of Police, could appeal to the POC.

Each appeal is listed by Citizen Police Complaint (CPC) number. A brief description of the case is given. A timeline is provided of when the dispositional letter by the Chief was issued, the date the citizen requested an appeal, when it was first set, if it was reset and then when the case was heard. The date of the decision of the POC is indicated and when a request was made for the CAO to review the decision of the POC.

The officer involved is referred to by the numeric code assigned by the IRO. It should be noted that no officer ever appeared before the POC. The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) implicated in the complaint is listed, accompanied by the original Internal Affairs (IA) investigative finding and whether or not the IRO concurred with the IA finding. The recommendation of the POC is indicated as well as whether or not the Chief followed the recommendation. Finally, any decision by the CAO is indicated.

As with all Parts of the Report, the CPC and Officer numbers can be cross-referenced to other Parts of the Report for further information on a particular case or officer.

A Sergeant telephoned citizen and advised him that a complaint had been filed against him by Attorney Tom Clear's office for telephone harassment. Sqt. told citizen that he had made 80 calls to Clear's office that day and citizen responded that he had only made two calls that day. Citizen told the Sqt. that calling him on the phone was not proper procedure and that he should have asked citizen to come in so that his attorney could have accompanied him. Sqt. then asked him, "What are you now, a cop?", and citizen replied that he was familiar with the legal field. Citizen also stated that Sqt. had not asked him any questions during the telephone conversation. Sgt. told citizen to stop calling Clear and then hung up the phone. Citizen felt that Sgt. was acting at Clear's direction which citizen considered improper. Citizen surmised that Clear gave Sqt. the wrong address for him on purpose so that a warrant would issue for non appearance. Citizen, a former Clear employee and Clear were involved in an ongoing employment dispute and there were numerous phone calls between the two men. Citizen asked Sgt. for the identity and phone number of his supervisor, which Sgt. provided. The supervisor was not called. During the phone call citizen claimed to have been introduced to Sqt. in Clear's office previously by Angela, an employee of Clear's and a friend of the Sqt. Sqt. said that they had not met. Citizen saw Sqt. in Clear's office several times. When citizen failed to appear in court in response to the summons sent to his old address, a warrant was issued, and subsequently citizen was arrested by Officer and other officers. Citizen stated that he was afraid for his life when he was arrested. Citizen stated that Rick, Clear's office manager. or Angela called Sgt. to tell him there was a warrant out on him.

The following is summarized from the Standard Operating Procedures Manual of the Albuquerque Police Department:

The Albuquerque Police Department provides for police protection, law enforcement, investigation, crime prevention, and maintenance of order in the community. In order to carry out their duties and responsibilities, the police are empowered with legal authority. To achieve success, the Department must win and retain the confidence and respect of the citizens it serves. Police officers do not act for themselves, but for the public. To that end, it is necessary to create and maintain a system through which the Department can be effectively directed and controlled. Written directives have been incorporated into Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to guide and direct department personnel in the performance of their duties. Violations of these provisions may result in disciplinary charges against personnel. Standard Operating Procedures are defined as written orders by the Chief of Police or a bureau, division, or section commander to define policy and direct procedures for specific situations or events.

The Citizen Police Complaints (CPC) received have implicated the following alleged violations of Standard Operating Procedures. Listed under each implicated SOP are the CPCs in which the implicated SOP arose. The involved officers are described by numeric code. Finally, the Finding at the conclusion of the investigation, as well as the IRO Review and Chief's decision are indicated.

Please note that the words "IRO Would Add" indicate a recommendation by the IRO during the review process to consider violation of the specified SOP.

Also, please note that the language of some SOP sections is duplicative of language in other sections because recompilation changed the section numbers.

Each citizen complaint is assigned a unique number, in chronological order, for example CPC 123-03. An Internal Investigation (I) is an investigation initiated within APD and is investigated by Internal Affairs (IA).



Summary of Internal Annual Report- 2010

Pursuant to § 9-4-1-5(B) of the Ordinance, the POC shall have the power and duty to audit and monitor police shootings under investigation by the APD Internal Affairs Unit. Pursuant to § 9-4-1-6(C) the IRO will make findings related to police shootings to be forwarded to the POC. The following is a summary of officer involved shootings which were investigated by the Internal Affairs Unit and forwarded to the IRO for review. In addition, some internal investigations on excessive force were forwarded to the IRO for review. Again, please note officers are referred to by the numeric code assigned by the IRO. The numbers have no significance.

Also, please note that § 2-52-11 had been changed to § 2-52-03.

I Summary of Case

064-10 Officer was flagged down while driving on Interstate 40. Some citizens had gathered around a deer which had been struck and grievously injured by an automobile. Officer contacted APD, the Sheriff's Department and Game and Fish. After the officer had been waiting a significant amount of time, the deer began to cry out in apparent pain. Officer obtained authority from his supervisor and shot the animal one time in the brain stem with his .223 rifle which stopped the animal's suffering. The officer is qualified in the weapon he used and he was cautious in selecting an angle of fire which would not endanger the nearby citizens. Game and Fish was notified and advised the officer that they would retrieve the animal.

An entry team led by Officer B was positioned near the front door of the subject's house. Officer C, peeking through the blinds at the facing window in the second floor of the house next door, observed the subject with his knife raised, advancing toward the nearby hostage. Officer C knocked out the glass in the window where he was positioned, yelled "Drop the knife", and then fired at the subject who had ignored the command. Hearing Officer C's command, the shattering window and the shot; Officer B led the entry team through the West-facing front door of the residence and began to ascend the nearby stairs. When Officer B reached the stair landing he observed the subject, who was standing at the top of the stairs, clutching a large knife in his right hand and a microwave oven in his left hand. As Officer B prepared to deploy a flash-bang in the direction of the subject who was then about ten feet distant, the subject threw the microwave at Officer B. Officer B deflected the microwave with his elbow and thigh; however, in doing so he dropped the flash-bang on the stair. Officer B, attempting to avoid the temporary blinding effect of the flash-bang, took a step up the stair. The subject, using the cover of a pony wall on the second floor bordering the south side of the staircase, was swinging the knife toward the advancing Officer who had to step away and dodge the blade to avoid being cut. Estimating the location of the subject's body behind the pony wall from the position of his knife wielding arm. Officer B fired four shots from his rifle through the pony wall striking the subject. Officer B turned right and went around the end of the pony wall at the top of the stairs. Officer B found the prostrate subject still clutching the knife. The subject was handcuffed and then turned over to medics. Subject was transported to UNMH where he died.

184-09 Officers A and B, driving west on Central observed a tan Buick with very dim headlights driving eastbound on Central near 52nd Street. Officer A reversed his direction and followed the Buick. The Buick had no brake lights or tail lights. Later, the passenger in the Buick, explained that the headlights dimmed after the Buick had hit a pot hole in the road. Officer A was planning to make a traffic stop. Officer C, who was also eastbound on Central, pulled in behind the Buick and was in front of Officer A. The Buick turned north off Central and began a protracted and circuitous route which included running through a stop sign. Officers C and A turned on their emergency equipment. The Buick did not stop. A pursuit was authorized noting that a similar vehicle was being sought by Valley Command officers for involvement in a shooting. The pursuit of the Buick developed into a number of police vehicles led by Officer C. followed by Officers A and B. Sat. S and other responding units. During the pursuit, the passenger jumped out of the Buick and fled. When interviewed later, passenger stated that driver of the Buick, said that he did not want to get caught and be taken to jail because there was an outstanding warrant against him. Sergeant S stated that an officer radioed that the Buick's driver was seen to be holding a metallic object out of the car's window. The Buick driver was also observed with his head bobbing as he was groping for something in the car. For approximately 12 minutes the string of police cars pursued the Buick. Finally, on 51st Street, the driver, stopped the Buick, and fled. He carried a silver colored metallic object which Officer C believed to be a gun. Photographs of an ash tray, in the hand of a police officer show the appearance of the object which apparently was mistaken for a pistol. Officer C advised "Gun, gun, gun" or "He's got a gun, he's got a gun" over the radio as the driver ran into a driveway at 51st Street NW. Officers A and B were still in their police car when the driver stopped his car and was in the street. Driver faced directly toward them and Officer A saw what he believed to be "huge hand gun", like a "Desert Eagle" in the drivers left hand. Driver then ran into the driveway opening of a chain link fenced-in front yard. Officer A and Officer B got out of their car and chased the driver. Other pursuing officers were behind them or still in the street. Driver was still carrying the silver colored metallic object which A believed to be a gun, and Officer A ordered the driver to drop the gun. The driver did not drop the object. Driver ran along the driveway of the residence where he had fled from the street after leaving his car. He proceeded along the driver's side of a parked pickup in the driveway area until he encountered a solid fence at the back of the side yard close to the front of the pickup. His escape blocked, he began quickly to turn toward the pursuing Officer A. Officer A, fearing that driver was turning to shoot him, fired three shots. Proceeding toward the front of the pickup, Officer A saw light shining through two bullet holes in the solid fence and he thought that he had missed Lopez. When Officer A cautiously came ("peeking") around the front of the pickup he saw that the driver was on the ground still holding on to the silver colored metal object in his hand. Officer A fired one or two more shots, one of which struck Lopez. Officer B had been at the back of the pickup when the first shots were fired, and could not see driver. Officer B advanced along the passenger side of the truck until he came upon the recumbent driver partially under the right front part of the pickup. Other pursuing officers were behind Officers A and B, and did not see the shooting. Driver received two entrance gunshot wounds, one to the left anterior chest, and one to the right flank. Driver died from the wounds. A large silver colored ash tray was near driver's body. That ash tray appeared to be the one missing from the dashboard of the Buick. Ashes and cigarettes were strewn around the floor board of the Buick.

When they approached the unenclosed back yard they encountered two males sitting at a table. They also observed a brown Labrador/Pit Bull mix dog that jumped up from a couch where it has been lying next to the two males. The dog barked, growled and began running directly at the officers. The dog was large, weighing about 90 pounds, and it was not on a leash or chain. The approaching officers, A, B., and C, fearing that the advancing dog would inflict serious injury on one of them, fired a total of nine shots, hitting the dog with five bullets, which killed the dog. "The owner of the dog told the officers that he had recently put up a fence to keep people from coming into his yard and being attacked by his dog, which the owner described as being "very protective".
