On that horrible morning many lives were changed forever; our daughter April _____, took her life after suffering from postpartum depression. We were all in shock, we cried and stumbled around the house wondering why and how such a thing could happen to us...to her. Police Chaplain Ann Laurie Wells was on the scene and offered kind words, her presence was such a comfort to us. In addition, officers Jay Schwartz, Aaron Jones, Eric Garcia, Hondo Jaramillo and Officer Armijo were on the property. They made us feel secure and when one of us were off alone an officer would come by and offer a word of comfort and condolence for our loss. They were all kind and talked to our grandchildren, in an effort to keep the children calm in a house full of strangers and people crying. I noticed that some of the police cars were parked around the corner and only one was in front of the house, for some reason, it seemed more respectful and did not call a lot of attention to our unfathomable situation. Construction workers were coming to the site early that morning to work on the bathroom, my son-in-law didn't think to call them to cancel, one of the police officer handled the matter delicately, and sent the workers away. We will struggle with our loss for the rest of our lives, but the kindness and professionalism that the officers at APD showed us will forever be the only bright spot on the day. We love and support the men and women of the APD. Thank you for being there in our time of need.

On the morning of January 23, a good friend of mine and I set out on a hike in the Sandia Mountains to see if we could locate the TWA crash site and then continue up to the Sandia Crest. The hike started out normal and we were prepared for the deep snow and rugged terrain ahead. At some point along the hike we made a mistake and took a wrong turn leading us off of the trail with no guidance as to what direction to take. We decided to continue on a little further and finally caught site of the Sandia Tram cables overhead. We knew that if we followed the cables we would be heading in the right direction and would find an alternate route to make it to the crest. As the day went on we got closer to the top not knowing that we would soon be very lost, stranded and unprepared to comfortably make it through the night. Night fell and we were encountering extremely rugged terrain that stopped us from continuing. At that point my friend and I decided that we were in a bad spot and needed help desperately. After coordination with multiple emergency management teams and hours of hopelessness we were greeted by two Albuquerque Police Department Open Space members – Officer Chad Melvin and Officer Anthony Martinez. Their quick response time while navigating the rocky terrain of the snowy Sandia Mountains and overwhelming professionalism while locating us made it quickly identifiable that we were in great hands. After they supplied us with food, water, and dry clothes, we made the six hour descent through the rugged terrain to the trailhead where medical crews were awaiting.

The true dedication shown here by Officer Chad Melvin, Officer Anthony Martinez and all other parties involved shows just how hard these men and women work day in and day out. These officers went above and beyond to risk their lives while saving ours and is a true example of commitment and teamwork that keeps Albuquerque safe. They are great heroes and Albuquerque is grateful to have them.
