2. Deputy Commander Troy Nicko verbally reported on Use of Force, Serious Use of Force and the current reduction of Serious Use of Force listed. He noted there have been eight Office Involved Shooting for the year. Deputy Commander Nicko finalized his report with the number of completed Sustained Investigations out of twenty-three all were withing policy.

3. Academy- Lieutenant Seam Higdon

- i. Lieutenant Sean Higdon verbally reported from the month of January 2026 until August 2026 the Academy has graduated forty-one cadets and Officers that have left the department to retirement, resignation or termination is thirty-seven. He stated a new Web Site being created will assist in recruiting Officers right now there has been ninety- two individuals that have submitted interest cards so far and the web site is not completed. Lieutenant Higdon finalized his report noting APD has cut ties with CNM for the training for PSA's and it will now be in house training

c. City Attorney- Lindsey Rosebrough, Managing Attorney

- i. Lindsey Rosebrough verbally reported City Attorney's Office started a new program in Metro Court in coordination with Metro Court, the Public Defender's Office and the District Attorney's Office called the CABQ Friday Arraignment Program. This program will assist in some of the citation

being filed by Officers for certain City Ordinances Violations. She finalized her report by stating the number of participants has gone up and is looking forward to the success of this program.

1. Member Georgia Duncan gave a verbal overview of the Officer Involved Shooting (OIS) case # 25-0068673

4. Chair Calderon asked Lieutenant Seam Higdon for clarification on the use of a 40 Millimeter in this case Lieutenant Sean Higdon stated there is not enough 40 Millimeters on the force due to budget issues and the expensive price of that weapon.
5. Member Bolyanatz had question on the Officers ability to de-escalate the situation. Deputy Commander Troy Nicko noted there was an attempt to de-escalate and sometimes the pace advances quickly and the officers have to make a quick decision.
6. Chair Calderon made a motion that the Civilian Police Oversight Member Board affirms and upholds the finding of the APD Internal Affairs Force Division Investigation for APD Case # 25-0068673. The Motion was seconded by Vice Chair Budanauro. The motion passed by 4 to 1.
7. Member Bolyanatz stated he rejected the motion due to the review he felt there was time for the officers to use a taser on a split-second decision.
