Motion to establish priorities for the Long Term Planning Committee

Chairman Shine moved to establish the following three priorities for the Long Term Planning Committee's activities for the near future:

- 1. The number and types (with brief description) *of all police involved shooting investigations* conducted by the APD Internal Affairs Unit in the last 5 years, with resolution and discipline imposed and with an analysis of trends and ranking by sanction category; and
 - a. The revision of Standard Operating Procedure 2-31, relating to procedures for investigating officer involved shootings
- 2. Discussion of Ordinance Amendments
 - a. 90 day limitation for complaints
 - b. 90 days to complete investigation
 - c. IRO/IA roles in use of force investigations
 - d. Redaction of officers' names
 - e. Redaction of complainant's names
 - f. POC role in disciplinary system
 - g. POC use of compelled APD officer's statements
 - h. Other Civilian Oversight Models
 - 1. Views of UNM researcher Desi Brown
- 3. Discussion of civil litigation against APD officers, trends and analysis
 - a. The number and types (with brief description) of all cases in the last five years, with resolution and officer discipline, if any, that resulted
 - b. What does City, APD, Risk Management do with adverse information developed during litigation?
 - c. What systems could be developed to utilize the information developed during civil litigation to revise APD training, SOP's, disciplinary system, etc.

The Committee tabled the Motion until the April meeting of the Long Term Planning Committee to give the public an opportunity to comment on the Committee's proposed priorities and for the Committee members to deliberate further.
