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Status of CRC 132-18

- **Trial Starts for Dad Accused of Prostituting Girl, Albuquerque Journal, February 26, 2019**
 - *Dad arrested on May 2, 2018*
- **CPOA case 132-18 remains open awaiting resolution of POB requests for additional investigation.**
 - *Citizen complaint filed May 30, 2018*
 - Public record letter to that outlines the findings and recommendations for the CPC 132-18 on POB agenda for October 11, 2018 meeting
 - The POB has returned the investigation twice and only recently the Case Review Subcommittee returned it once again to the CPOA in attempts to determine if all applicable SOP violations have been reported
 - The POB also wants to know if the incident suggests that APD should revise strategies and tactics; identified a need for additional training, counseling or other non-disciplinary corrective measures; or suggests revisions to policy and procedures.
 - CPOA did not make any of these assessments due to time constraints and has not yet as a result of POB requests
- **APD initiated two Special Orders on June 6, 2018 dealing with historical contacts with juvenile families and collection of evidence based upon the APD response to the incident in complaint CPC-132-18**

APD Special Orders 18-71 and 18-72, Dated June 6, 2018

SO 18-71 - Use Of CACU Case Management System And CYFD Law Enforcement Portal

- Effective immediately all officers encountering allegations of child abuse or neglect on any call for service or field interaction will contact the RTCC and request a query for information through both the CACU case management system and the CYFD Law Enforcement Portal.
- This approach to information gathering by officers in the field will alert them to the possibility that a child contacted in the field has a history of being abused or neglected.

SO-18-72 - Gathering And Retention Of Potential Criminal Evidence In Child Abuse And Neglect Matters

- The purpose of this Special Order is to assure that any potential physical evidence of a crime observed by an officer during the execution of his law enforcement duties related to allegations of child abuse and neglect, is gathered and retained.
- Regardless of whether the incident is considered a crime scene or a crime is reported, the officer will nonetheless collect all items of possible evidentiary value presented to the officer by any person, or observed or collected by the officer(s) on-scene.
- If a crime has not been reported at the time of the seizure, the evidence shall be entered into storage using a unique numerical identifier for a non-reported crime. This approach to the gathering and retention of evidence is being undertaken to assure that evidence of ongoing abuse or neglect of a child, which may not be self-evident, is preserved for a future criminal prosecution of any offender.
