### IV. Chairman Reports

### City Treasury Report(s) & Presentation – Cilia Aglialoro

- Revenue Summary
  - o FY22 completed and all revenue received for June and August
  - o Month to month for June 2022 vs. 2021 21.33%; up 159.81% from 2020

- o Cumulative growth for FY 22 vs. FY21, up 84% percent; up 45.76% from FY20
- 151 lodging establishments are reporting; 4 have liens. Information and reasons for nonpayment provided on some lodging establishments that have not paid.
- o Review submission form for long-term facilities seeking exemption.

### V. ASM Global Monthly Report – Ray Roa

- 31 total events: 24 at the convention center operation at 11% occupancy. ARSC had 7 events, operated at 69% occupancy.
- 8 returning groups in July and 16 new business for month of July.
- 22 events booked in July; 16 businesses turned down.
- Highlights include 29 booking in August.

# VI. Visit Albuquerque (Albuquerque Convention and Visitors Bureau) Monthly Report – Tania Armenta/ Marisol Lucero

- Tourism Insights:
  - July Comparisons: Local occupancy is higher than comp set, but lower than national average; however revpar and monthly ADR collections are still trailing comp and national average.
  - ABQ Market Demand by Week: Determining what post-COVID demand vs. seasonal demand. Weekly market demand in last week of August was down only 1% from 2021; occupancy only down 8% from 2021.
  - o Slow to return to group and business travel; seen in downtown occupancy. Midweek occupancy is returning, however.
  - Weekday occupancy is up .3% and Weekend occupancy is down 3.7% compared to the same time last year.
  - o Market ADR by week up 11%
  - o Signs of weekday travel improving, will continue to monitor.
- Short-Term Rental Insights:
  - o All-time high of active listings: 1714.
  - o July ADR is \$193, 7% higher than July 2021.
  - In Hotel and Home Rental Market Performance Trend, ABQ Market is considered suburban. Most of the home rentals that are coming online nationally are in areas that are not serviced by large hotels.
  - Macro economy report: Suburban Market (ABQ) has recovered to 96% of its revpar from 2019. Oxford models do not see near term recession.
  - Business Travel: Group ADR up 105% and revpar 73% compared to 2019; Transient ADR up 117% and revpar up 102% compared to 2019
- July 2022 Destination Dashboard
  - Sunport passenger for FY21: Increase in 21% over June 2021; FY22 still behind FY18 by 1.1 million travelers.
  - Leisure and Hospitality employment statistics: 45,000 up 14% compared to June 2021, up 36% from June 2020.
  - o 25 meetings in July 2022 compared to 16 in July 2021.
  - o Future non-Citywide events: Booked 20 total non-citywide events for estimated direct spend of \$2,151,901.

- o Sporting Events FYTD: 11 events with direct spend estimated at \$1.2 million
- o 4,689 total nights booked
- o 21 total lost events; 19,314 lost room nights; 9,846 lost attendees; \$8.4 million lost estimated direct spend.
- o Sept. 13<sup>th</sup> Visit Albuquerque Annual Event invitation; year in review and a look forward.
- o State Fair and Balloon Fiesta just around the corner.
