### IV. Chairman Reports

#### City Treasury Report(s) & Presentation – Cilia Aglialoro

- Revenue Summary -
  - July 2022 1.9mill in revenue from Lodgers Tax, 10.28% increase in Accumulative Change Total in FY23.

- o 222.66% increase in Delinquent Lodger's Tax revenues in FY23 vs. FY22.
- Delinquent Liens include 4 hotels with a lien and 14 hotels with no payments in last 6 months.
- Cilia displays the list of Delinquent hotels with 166,328\$ delinquent in STR & Hotels.
   Surprisingly the majority of are owned by the same person.
- Zoning for hotels is NOT the same as for apartments. Hotels who converted to Apartments have had to change their use.

## V. ASM Global Monthly Report – Ray Roa

- August Total of Events: 24
  - o 6 Banquets, 4 concerts, 7 Meetings, 3 Sporting events and 3 others
- Leading Sources for booking in August:
  - $\circ$  ASMG 92%, VABQ 8%
- ACC operated at 15 % occupancy while ARSC operated at 45% occupancy.
- 14 repeat businesses & 6 new groups.
- 30 Total Turned Down Events due to date availability, no responses from prospects and ABQ being outside a specific tour route.
- September brings 28 events to come.

# VI. Visit Albuquerque (Albuquerque Convention and Visitors Bureau) Monthly Report – Tania Armenta/ Marisol Lucero

- Tourism Insights:
  - 5-Year ADR is \$109.10 which is less than the National average and Comp. Set at over 125\$.
  - o ABQ Market Demand:
    - Was up 4% over the same week last year
  - Weekly occupancy for Downtown is at 53%.
  - o ABQ Market has Saturdays at highest occupancy at 75.1%
  - Weekend Occupancy is up 0.2 points and weekday occupancy is up 5.1 points vs last year.
  - Weekly Market ADR is up \$9.02 vs last year.
  - o In the most recent 30 days, higher mid-week demand has given a higher ADR & occupancy over the weekend.
  - o ABQ Short term rentals are up nearly 500 listings.
- July 2022 Destination Dashboard
  - o Average Hotel Occupancy down 9% vs. July 2021.
  - Average Daily Rate up 13% vs. July 2021
  - o July 2022 Occupancy Rates for Albuquerque is 68%, 2% less than National Average.
  - o July 2022 ADR for Albuquerque s \$111.43.
  - o 431,650 Total passengers in July 2022. 14% more than July of 2021.
  - o United and American Airlines are increasing their share of the Airlines Market.
  - Social Media followers is up 20% and Social Media Engagement is up 147%.

- Hiring Nichole Besseraas, the Destination Director of convention and tourism. Nichole starts October 10<sup>th</sup> 2022
- o Total August bookings 496

- O Social Media Marketing overall increase in Activity, like, and Engagements.
