City Treasury Report(s) & Presentation – Cilia Aglialoro & Charlotte LaBadie



- 1.86 Million for both lodgers and hospitality, with an increase of 2% from last year in FY22. Cumulative growth is 2.03 percent.
- 3.86% increase in current monthly rev.
- 3 entities with liens.
 - Revenue was reported, but nothing was being paid.
- Informational slide on hotels that were listed that were reporting revenue but not making any tax payments:
 - October 6th inspections for 11 hotels were conducted. 4 are still operating under STR
 - Mountain View Suites Inn and Park and French Quarter Hotel are under new management. Will be reporting soon under new management
 - 2 hotels, La Puerta Lodge and Grand View Hotel, were operating but in long-term status.
 - 2 hotels were flipped into housing units.
 - 3 are closed down, Motel 1, The Ramada, and Highway House Motel.
 - A letter will be sent to other establishments whom the city had issues getting in contact with.
- The chair requests an in-depth conversation to evaluate these losses.

VI. Visit Albuquerque (Albuquerque Convention and Visitors Bureau) Monthly Report – Tania Armenta

• September

- Hotel occupancy is <u>less up less</u> than 1% down vs <u>calendar year to date through</u> <u>August. last year.</u>
- Airport passenger traffic for August was up 11% versus August 2022.
- 46,000 people employed in hospitality in August.
- <u>Business Occurring for the month of September equated to</u> 7,852 room nights, 15,00 in attendance, 23% increase in direct spending.
- Future city-wide events <u>booked have bookedinclude</u> 3 new city-wides bringing 4.2 million in spending and 9 citywides in total FYTD.
- <u>The team has booked 27 new non-city-wide events and 55 total non-citywides</u> <u>FYTD.</u>
