# FIRE DEPARTMENT INFORMATIONAL REPORT

**APRIL - MAY 2018** 

#### SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

#### ALARM ROOM / TECHNICAL SERVICES

Alarm Room has reported a total of 7,493 emergency calls and 9,211 non-emergency calls for the month of April. April 8 - 14th was National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week. AFD Alarm room has 28 dispatchers who work hard around the clock to protect and give life safety instructions for the citizens of Albuquerque. Dominic Gallegos received the first ever Dispatcher of the Year Award for his extraordinary job performance.

**Technical Services Division** is working on financial solutions to fund fire station phone upgrades to a VoIP system that uses an IP network for transmitting calls instead of PSTN networks. Field testing of the new XG-75Pe portable radios has revealed reception issues in specific conditions but will be resolved in the near future. City IT would like to set up administrative accounts for Dropbox to avoid potential security threats that have been linked to the use of this product.

#### FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE / ARSON

FMO reported 526 inspections and 239 re-inspections for April. The Fire Marshal's Office also is active in fire safety training. This includes fire alarm drills and public education in facilities such as retirement communities and schools. In April, this training was provided to 160 children and 356 citizens.

The **Arson Division** responded to 22 fires in April. 16 of those fires were found to be intentional including a playground, Bosque fires, an apartment complex, dumpsters, and most notably, the Rail Yard fire. David Hickman was sentenced to 20 years in Federal prison for his connection in 8 incendiary fires including the Carlisle Condominiums.

#### FLEET MANAGEMENT / LOGISTICS / CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

Fleet reported total in-house an vendor maintenance costs this month were \$57,902.00 and total fuel costs for all April. Major facility repairs/improvements totaled vehicles were \$24,686.00.

Logistics reported 18 repairs made to turnout gear at a cost of \$2125.02. New this month are designated station "Tour Bags" that contain clean turnout gear for children to see during station tours and avoid contaminated gear. Donations of surplus hose were made to UNM Hospital and the Eagle Scouts for a CABQ Zoo project.

Capital Improvement had 106 requests for service for \$32,745.31. All bay doors received red/green light indicators to help avoid apparatus accidents involving doors that are not completely open.



#### TRAINING / EMS / HAZ-MAT / WILDLAND

AFD Academy paramedic students started their field internships April 16th. They are on course to take the National Registry test in June and be used in the field soon after. The 90th Cadet Class is three quarters of the way through and scheduled to graduate June 15th. Structured oral interviews start soon for candidates of the 91st Cadet class. Plans for a lateral firefighter class are in the works as well as reviewing current candidate requirements and pay scales to ensure our department is competitive and that we attract the best employees. AFD facilities were host to the Open Source Intelligence Analysis Course and APD Swat training in April and early May. FIRE OPS 101 was held at the Academy as well and offered local and State officials to take part in the many aspects of firefighting and EMS.

**EMS Division** is hard at work developing the Community EMS/BLS truck programs and now have Deputy Chief Emily Jaramillo, Battalion Chief Chris Ortiz, and Captain Nathaniel Meisner to lead that initiative. Emergency Management Division completed risk assessment for Mountain Mahogany School and has six more schools lined up in the future. CNM staff were trained in "STOP the Bleed" training by AFD personnel. Captain Jackie White was invited by FEMA to represent AFD and City of Albuquerque at a FEMA symposium in Washington D.C.

**HAZ-MAT** held training with the US Postal Inspector Main Post Office for anthrax training exercise.




















#### AFD STATION 7

- Engine 7 participated in the ABQ Neighborwoods Tree Planting event that promotes increased vegetation in neighborhoods with below average tree canopies.
- Engine 7 joined Station 17 for master stream training.
- Station 7 hosted a tour for forty children ages 5-6.
- This station is noting an increase of calls generated by Transit Security for ETOH patients in the general area in addition to bus stops.
- Station 7 and BC 4 was invited for Freddy's Frozen
   Custard and Steakburgers for food and beverages as a
   token of appreciation.



## AFD STATION 17 / BC 4

- Battalion Chief Chad Kim traveled to Austin, Texas to represent New Mexico at the 2018 EMS for Children's conference. Chad is the Family Representative for EMSC which is a 100% volunteer position which he has held for about 10 years.
- Engine 17 attended a Family Fun Day event at Coors Crossing
- Engine 317, Engine 17, and Rescue 22 participated in special Wildland training in the Bosque drafting water
- with the Floto Pump in the Rio Grande river. Other training Station 17 completed included use of the master stream with Engine 7.
- Engine 7, Rescue 7, and BC 4 had a significant EMS call involving a 15 month old child in cardiac arrest. The crews quickly identified and treated an airway obstruction and the child was transported to the hospital. The child was later discharged without complications.

- Station 18 will be hosting a recruiting event for the Boy Scouts of America and offering station tours.
- Station 18 also hosted a tour for a group of adults with disabilities.
- Councilor Borrego purchased TIC cameras for Rescues 18, 21, and 22. The chargers for these cameras have now been placed on those recues. Councilor Borrego has also provided landscaping rocks for Station 18.
- Station 18 responded to a call for an elderly female that had not been seen in some time. On arrival, crews had to force the door for entry. The patient was found unresponsive, but alive, and was transported to the hospital.





#### **AFD STATION 14**

- Engine 14 participated in the ABQ Neighborwoods Tree Planting event that promotes increased vegetation in neighborhoods with below average tree canopies.
- Station 14 hosted a Safer NM Car Seat Clinic.
- Station 14 hosted a tour for 20 kids from Carlos Rey Child Development.
- Rescue 14 participated in an emergency preparedness drill at Nusenda Community Stadium and worked with staff to educate and train them in all aspects of patient care in the event of injuries.
- Station 14 assisted in treating and safely transporting multiple patients, mostly children, involved in a motor vehicle rollover. Also of note, on a separate incident, a critical respiratory distress patient was quickly assessed, treated with magnesium sulfate, and stabilized while transported to the hospital.

#### **AFD STATION 1**

- Engine crew 1 displayed the truck for over 20 children at A Child's Garden Preschool.
- Engine 1 was requested for "Community Servants" week at First United Methodist Church for kids to see and discuss fire safety.
- Station 1 responded to several small Bosque fires this month as well as the Railyard Fire on 4/23. A vehicle rollover involved extrication of a trapped victim (right).



#### **AFD STATION 2**

- Engine 2 was on standby for a concert pyrotechnics display at Isleta Amphitheater.
- Rescue 2 is one of many units that is providing an internship for paramedic students and will be accommodating the student for the next several weeks.
- Station 2 responded to the airport for a cardiac arrest on the plane.
   Off Duty AFR member Miguel Tittman happened to be on the plane at the time and performed immediate CPR until AFD crews arrived. The
- patient ultimately survived and was eventually discharged from the hospital.
- Station 2 responded to a male that had fallen three stories onto a concrete surface sustaining life threatening injuries. Due to the responding providers, the patient is still alive and recovering.

#### AFD STATION 4 / BC 1

- Engine 4 was on standby for the Isotopes post-game fireworks show.
- Station 4 hosted a tour for a group of children.
- Ladder 4 attended the current drivers class at the AFD Training Academy to assist with instruction and teach Ladder operations.
- Engine 4 hosted a USAF EMT-B Para Rescue student for two day shift ride-a-longs.
- Rescue 4 attended the APS Career Enrichment Center graduation for the EMT class. These students graduated with all prerequisites met to be eligible to apply for AFD in 2019.

#### **AFD STATION 6**

- Station 6 Rescue Lt. Tim Jonas was awarded a Lifesaving Certificate by the Orange County Fire Authority for initiating care of a cardiac arrest victim while in San Clamente, CA in November of 2017 and was also recently recognized by IAFF 244 and AFD.
- Lt. David Cruz was also recognized for his efforts in two separate wildland deployments, one of which the crews encountered a major
- MVA on their way to a wildland deployment and initiated care.
- Engine 6 and BC 1 responded in BCFD district on a mutual aid call involving a structure on fire.

- Station 10 hosted a tour for a small group of student with disabilities.
- During a Bosque fire operation this month, Brush 10 laid over 300 feet of hose supplied by a Floto Pump from the Rio Grande to aid in extinguishing the fire.
- Station 6 were successful in extinguishing an early morning car fire at Cochiti Elementary School and later in the month, an abandoned structure off of Rio Bravo.





#### **AFD STATION 15**

- Engine 15 presented the truck for a show-and-tell event at a preschool.
- Station 15 and BC 3 attended the annual potluck for the Academy Estates Neighborhood Association held at the JCC and were there to support the neighborhood and answer questions.
- Engine 15 was on EMS standby for the Multiple Sclerosis Walk around the Albuquerque Academy.
- Engine 15 attended First Responder Night at Osuna Elementary to show the truck and answer questions.
- Ladder 15 hosted an aerial training session for apparatus drivers within Battalion 3 district.

- TIC cameras were purchased for Rescues 18, 21, and 22. The chargers for these cameras have now been placed on those recues, thank you Councilor Borrego.
- Engine 22 presented the truck and was on EMS standby for the Renaissance fair at Balloon Fiesta Park.
- AIG Insurance brought food to Station 22 to show appreciation for firefighters.





#### **AFD STATION 3**

- Station 3 hosted a Safer NM Car Seat Clinic.

 Squad 2 assisted Station 8 with a foothill rescue for an injured hiker.



## AFD STATION 5 / BC 2

- Station 5 received "Vial of Life" packets from UNM College of Pharmacy students to distribute among citizens in their district. These packets are to be filled out by the citizen and kept in a conspicuous place within the home and will list pertinent medical information to be given to first responders on emergency calls.
- Station 5 crews surprised a family, returning home from the hospital, with groceries and toys.
- Battalion 2 Chief Skip Tinagero retired this month after 25 years of service.
- Station 5 responded to several critical emergencies and fires this month and were involved rescuing three



- Station 11 received "Vial of Life" packets from UNM College of Pharmacy students to distribute among citizens in their district. These packets are to be filled out by the citizen and kept in a conspicuous place within the home and will list pertinent medical information to be given to first responders on emergency calls.
- Engine 11 welcomed a USAF PJ EMT-B student to ride on the truck for a day as part of the UNMH EMS curriculum.
- R11 helped treat and transport a 2 year old burn victim after units were called to a tent on fire in a residential backyard.





#### **AFD STATION 9**

• Station 9 participated in aerial ladder and fire protection systems training.

• Station 9 hosted a tour for a group of cub scouts.

#### **AFD STATION 13**

- Engine 13 was on standby for Isotopes post game fireworks display.
- Engine 13 accommodated a high school senior with a ride-a-long for an end of the year mentorship program.
- R13 and E13 were dispatched to the Barnes and Noble in Coronado mall at 6600 Menaul Blvd regarding a male patient who had experienced a syncopal episode. The patient had been at customer service when the employees noticed that he did not look very good and helped him down to the floor when he experienced a brief syncopal episode. The employees activated EMS on the patients behalf. Upon R13 arrival E13 was on scene attending the patient. During vitals, the LP-15 gave a STEMI alert and the patient was

loaded onto the AAS gurney and transport was initiated immediately. While beginning transport the patient had a cardiac seizure and the patients ECG showed Ventricular fibrillation. R13 officer and AAS personnel converted the patient with a single defibrillation at 360J and the patient immediately regained consciousness and was able to ask what had happened. A STEMI alert was sent out to the receiving hospital, Presbyterian Downtown, and the patient was delivered to the hospital alert though still in critical condition. The next day a message was sent from Laura Douglas, the Presbyterian STEMI Coordinator, that the patient was in good condition and had experienced a totally occluded Right Coronary Artery. The patient apparently has a good prognosis. The guys on the engine, rescue, and AAS unit worked very admirably on this call and it had a great

- Station 19 responded to a vehicle accident that required the use extrication tools to gain access to the patient. Also (right) Engine 19 was on scene to

extinguish a car fire on the freeway.








#### **AFD STATION 16**

- Station 8 along with APD Open Space and HTR squad 2 worked together to rescue an inured hiker in the foothills.





- Station 8 welcomed three separate ride-a-long opportunities for an MD Resident, a USAF EMT-B student, and a


- high school student working on her senior project.
