CURRENT EVENTS

- **3/1** – Residential structure fire on Oahu NE in **Station 16** district
- **3/8** – Residential fire on the 12000 block of Central SW in **Station 14** district
- **3/5** – 1000 Residential fire on the 1000 block of Valencia SE in **Station 11** District
- **3/12** – Auto accident on I-25 Frontage Rd HTR Squad 2 was needed for a car pinned underneath a semi-truck in **Station 4** district
- **3/13** – RV fire that extended to the neighboring house in **Station 19** district
- **3/15** – Active shooter on the 500 block of Candelaria NW in **Station 6** District
- **3/18** – Single story apartment fire on the 400 block of Georgia St SE in **Station 11** district, 29 occupants were displaced and relocated
- **3/19** – Apartment fire on 5700 Copper NE in **Station 11** district
- **3/31** – Residential fire on the 2700 block of Morningside NE in **Station 13** district, Rescue 3 transported a 3 year old with minor burns and smoke inhalation
- **4/7** – Residential fire involving a large storage shed in the backyard in **Station 11** district 1000 block if Indiana St SE
- **4/7** – Residential fire fully involved mobile home on 2600 block New York SW in **Station 7** district



AFD members visited with a young girl who suffered minor burns and smoke inhalation at UNMH.



AFD Wildland Division sent a Strike Team Leader and one Type 6 engine staffed with 3 personnel to the Stateline Fire (under the NM-RMP) located in Clayton, NM. Our personnel were deployed on March 20th, at 1800 hours. Our resources were part of a Strike Team of engines that were assembled from multiple agencies around the ABQ metro area for this wildfire. While traveling to this incident, the crews witnessed a rollover accident and extricated/treated patients while coordinating air and ground resources for transport. One patient was flown to UNMH in Albuquerque and four others were transported by ground to other hospitals.



COMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- AFD Wildland Division attended the East Mountain Wildfire public education meeting in Tijeras.
- This month there were over 20 community involvement projects that consisted of station tours and visits to various locations throughout the city. FMO was also involved in several building evacuation drills, fire extinguisher training classes, and fire safety public education classes.

FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE / ARSON

- Fire Marshal's office performed 476 inspections this month and 164 re-inspections for a total of 640 inspections.
- FMO miFire testing has started to include inspections of the five largest buildings per district.
- All field responses involving elevators are being reported to FMO from our records management on a weekly basis. FMO then refers those to City Building to ensure an elevator inspection is performed.
- Arson Division Fire Investigators responded to two Bosque fires this month, both classified as incendiary in nature. The FI Division is currently researching the feasibility of a K9 for the Albuquerque Fire Rescue Department. The two viable options are with the ATF and State Farm. Both entities provide the trained K9 at no charge to the department. Due to the Grant writing efforts of Driver M. Schum, the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) has been awarded. Items awarded included monies for the K9 program (\$18,000.00).

FLEET MANAGEMENT / LOGISTICS / CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

- 13 units had their preventative maintenance performed this month. Fleet completed maintenance expenditures equaled \$53,606 and Vendor completed maintenance expenditures were \$4,188.00. Total fuel costs this month was \$31,812.00.
- 39 sets of turnout gear were washed and inspected. 38 repairs were made costing \$2,424.00. 448 sets of turnout gear replacements are projected for 2018 and the current cadet class will be acquiring 39 new sets costing \$110,240.00. 34 sofas were delivered to various fire stations this month for replacement.
- There were 70 requests for service this month for station repairs/maintenance. Facility repairs and improvements totaled \$56,504.86 this month with the majority of the cost dedicated to the interstitial doorway projects currently being implemented at various stations.

TRAINING / EMS / HAZ-MAT / HTR / WILDLAND

- Multiple CNM students were involved with the ride-a-long program on several different Engine companies throughout the city this month.
- The AFD Academy has started teaching the annual CE classes for EMS licensure requirements. Efforts continue with ensuring all AFD members have completed their annual wildland pack test. This test consists of a 3 mile walk with a 45 lb weight vest and must be completed in 45 min. 45 sec.
- April is National Autism Awareness Month. AFD is currently developing a course that will train our providers on how to respond to citizens with Autism spectrum disorder. This course will be implemented into the EMS CE refresher classes.
- The LUCAS Chest Compression System has been placed on the 78 Unit for use with cardiac arrest calls and will eventually be outfitted on all rescue apparatus. Crews have been receiving training on this device through the current annual CE refresher courses at the training academy. This device has already been used successfully with four cardiac arrest calls with two of those patients getting pulses back and transported to the hospital.



- AFD is collaborating with several other City departments to streamline the disposal of hypodermic needles for the Public with a project called SHARP (Safe Handling and Routing of Paraphernalia).
- Through the direction of the AFD Community EMS committee and EMS staff, progress is being made to outline the scope of the Mobile Integrated Healthcare units.

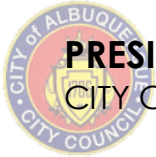

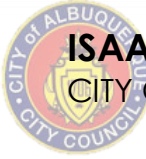

- Engine 22 presented the truck at a Crossfit charity event in Rio Rancho to help raise money and awareness for firefighters.

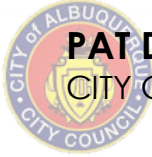

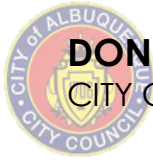

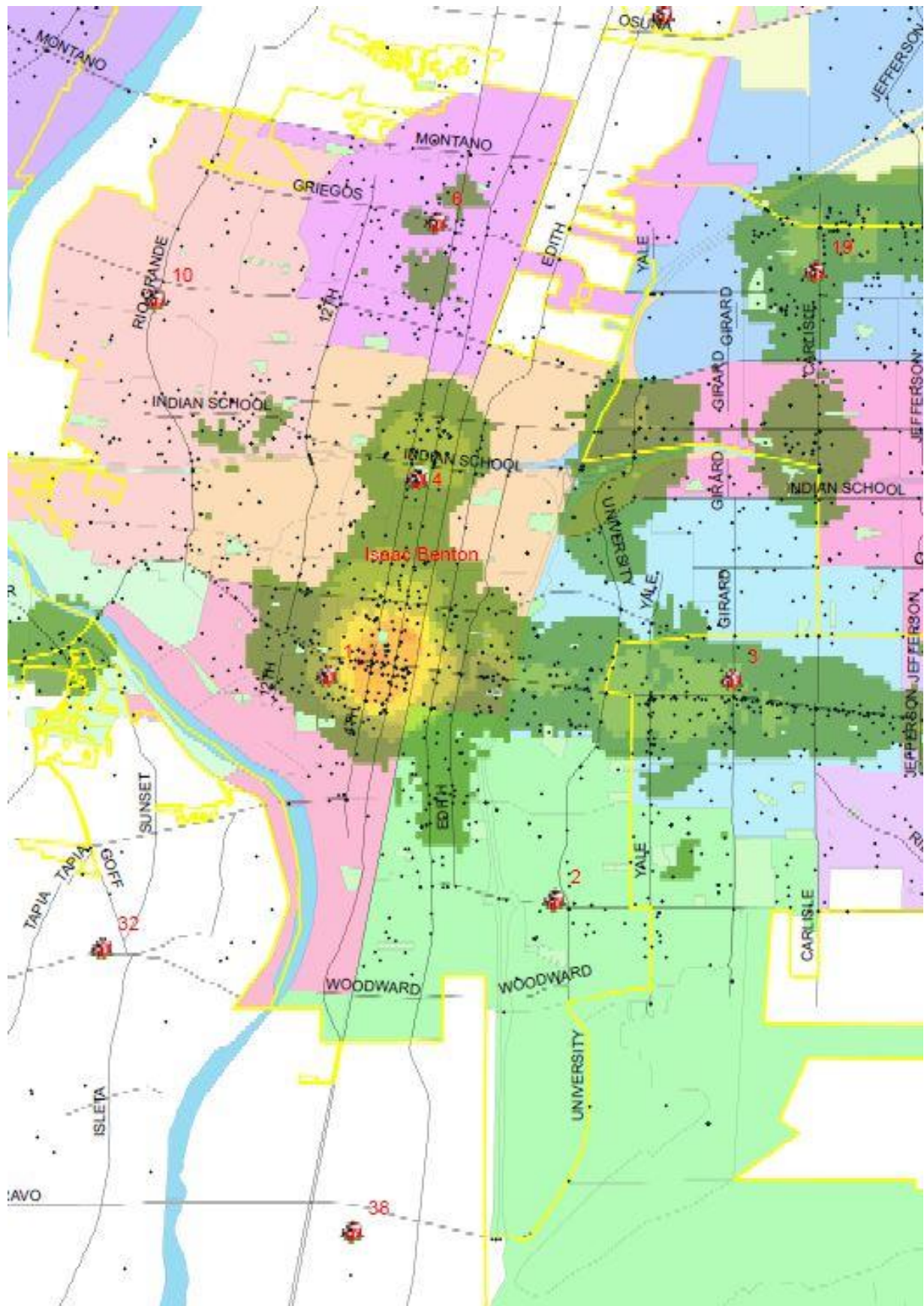
