





Draft Minutes Coordinated Street Outreach (CSO) Committee 3:30 – 5:00 pm August 27th, 2020

Committee Purpose – The purpose of the committee is to establish a shared approach to conducting street outreach among workgroup members. The workgroup defines street outreach as the process of connecting and building trust with people experiencing homelessness where they are, with the goal of helping each person meet his or her immediate needs for survival, and helping each person to achieve wellbeing, belonging and connection according to their own understanding.

Meeting Purposes:

- 1. To bring all meeting participants up to speed with current information with updates
- 2. To address system gaps and unmet needs with high impact strategies within the first 60 days of meeting
- 3. To address and identify our philosophies, limitations and potential to meet the needs of our community members experiencing homelessness.

2) Major Themes Re: Needs, Gaps:

Housing Vouchers or COVID Hotels are not a solution. We need a diversity of housing options for progressive engagement with special populations, (est. 10% of Individuals Experiencing Homelessness by Urban Institute Report) including individuals with:

- -brain injuries
- -evictions
- -felony records
- -violent behaviors
- -chronic and acute mental health issues
- -actively/consistently substance using
- -sex workers

Other Gaps:

- -LGBTQI
- -families
- -youth
- -precariously-housed

Need for improved discharge planning for individuals transitioning from the following:

- -out of foster care
- -out of jails/prisons
- -out of acute care hospitals
- -out of drug/alcohol treatment & recovery facilities

Question of how to capture and honor Faith-based outreach services.

Data Collection and Usage – Need shared HMIS report (Kevin Santry?); increasing coordination and avoiding duplication using technology (right folks to services at the right time).

Important to focus on function rather than job titles (as there is significant variation between definitions of "outreach" and "case management", for example.)
