

#### Safer Streets, Safer Neighborhoods

Strengthening Public Safety and Fighting Crime

- Expanded gunshot detection to cover 25% of ABQ to target gun violence.
- Operations to crack down on crime and hold problem hotels and motels accountable.
- Provided intervention services to 5,500+ domestic violence victims.
- Achieved a 90% homicide solve rate (79 cases solved in 2024).
- Reduced dangerous driving with automated speed enforcement.
- Expanded school-based violence prevention programs.
- Decreased violent crime and reversed record auto theft rates.

#### Investing in Public Safety Personnel & Resources

✓ Added 20 firefighters, three engines, and a rescue car.  Began construction of a new fire station.

#### DOJ Reform & Culture Change at APD

- Achieved full compliance with the federal decree.
- Established the nation's first 24/7 alternative response unit, ACS workers, and ensuring every resident has the opportunities they need to thrive.

- Expanded the Gateway Network, sheltering 900 people nightly.

abatements, a 140% increase from 2023.

- ✓ Delivered 601,839 meals and gave 57,932 senior rides.

- ✓ Added 10+ new direct flights from/to ABQ.

- ✓ Planted 15,000 trees toward the 100,000-tree goal.
- ✓ Cut CO₂ emissions by 52 metric tons with energyefficient upgrades.
- Diverted 7.5 tons of food waste through composting.
- ✓ Installed 38 solar projects and 18 EV charging stations.
- ✓ On track to power 100% of City facilities with solar by 2025.
- ✓ Transitioned citywide lighting to LED for cost efficiency.
