In a city celebrated for its vibrant mix of cultures, the International District is one of Albuquerque's most culturally diverse neighborhoods. Located along the bustling Central corridor and iconic Route 66, the "ID" has faced its share of challenges. After decades of underinvestment and neglect, the City is reversing structural inequities in the area through unprecedented new investments. From five new playgrounds to the district's new library, improved street and traffic infrastructure, and the first permanent headquarters of the Albuquerque Community Safety department, the City is committed to the revitalization and growth of this historic community.

City-Backed Redevelopment Projects with Housing Units

- SOMOS Project (Central Avenue & Alcazar Street, next to Talin Market) – 70-unit affordable housing complex with approximetly 1,000 sq. ft. of commercial space
- Garfield Townhomes (University Metropolitan Redevelopment Area) – A 16-unit LEED Platinum certified, 100% electric, energy-efficient townhomes
- Park Central Project (Near Heights Metropolitan Redevlopment Area) – Conversion of an abandoned office tower into 101 housing units
