
The Albuquerque Police Department Crisis Intervention Unit Data Book: A Working Compendium

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Background

In 2014, the City Of Albuquerque and the U.S. Department of Justice entered into an agreement often referred to as the CASA (Court Appointed Settlement Agreement) which identified a number of actions to be completed by the Albuquerque Police Department (APD).

The CASA paragraphs #129 and #137 direct APD to collect data on the use of crisis intervention certified responders for management purposes and to demonstrate the impact of and inform modifications to crisis prevention services. These data include:

- date, shift, and area command of the incident;
- subject's age, race/ethnicity, and gender;
- whether the subject was armed and the type of weapon;
- whether the subject claims to be a U.S. military veteran;
- name and badge number of crisis intervention certified responder or CIU detective on the scene;
- whether a supervisor responded to the scene;

- · techniques or equipment used;
- any injuries to officers, subjects, or others;
- disposition of the encounter (e.g., arrest, citation, referral); and
- a brief narrative of the event (if not included in any other document).
- number of individuals in the COAST and CIU case loads;
- number of individuals receiving crisis prevention services


CASA paragraph #130 also directs APD to these data to continually improve police training; practices and polices; and to identify systemic issues that impede the Department's ability to provide an appropriate responses individuals experiencing a mental health crisis.

The APD Crisis Intervention Unit Data Book is one way APD provides information about these data and our efforts to use this information to continually strengthen our ability to protect and serve our community.

Data Definitions

- 1. Throughout this report we refer to behavioral health related computer aided dispatch (CAD) incidents and police reports. Computer Aided Dispatches are 911 calls that are categorized as suicide or behavioral health in CAD descriptions. If CAD calls turn into incidents that required police reports, these reports may be categorized as suicide, behavioral health, mental commit, mental patient, or psychiatric evaluation depending on which record system is used and what year the report was filed.
- 2. The data come from Tiburon and other dynamic data bases and are continually updated as reports are completed and revised.
- 3. We fully understand that our data is based on behavioral health related incidents which are known to be behavioral health related by law enforcement at the time of occurrence. There are probably many incidents which are classified in other ways which have a behavioral health components and are missed in our analyses.
- 4. APD is continually improving its data collection and analyses systems and has made important progress. But clearly, complete and accurate data in law enforcement is a journey rather than a destination.


The Number Of APD's BH-Related CAD Calls By Year




The Number Of APD's BH-Related CAD Calls By Final Call Type And By Year




APD Responded To About 5,959 BH-Related CAD Calls From January 1, 2018 To October 15, 2018




Behavioral Health Issues Are An Aspect Of Many Different Kinds Of CAD Calls

APD Responded To About 12,600 Behavioral Health Related Calls For Service Between January 2017 and August 2018. These Are The Number Of Calls By Beat




Disposition Data For Individuals Involved In 10,577 CIT-Related Incidents January 1, 2017 To June 15, 2018





Disposition Data For Individuals Involved In 10,282 CIT-Related Incidents By Percentage By Month From January 2017 To May 2018




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
Total Number Of Behavioral Health Related Calls With Use of Force From January 1, 2015 To October 15, 2018




Behavioral Health Related Calls With Use of Force By Final CAD Call Type By Year From January 1, 2015 To October 15, 2018




APD Has Been Tracking The Implementation Of The CIT Worksheets These Data Are From January 2018 To September 2018






How The APD Crisis Intervention Unit Uses CIT Referrals And Reports

SUBJECT HAS MADE PREVIOUS STATEMENTS ABOUT WANTING TO KILL HIS MOTHER, HER HUSBAND, THEN HAVE POLICE KILL HIM


FATHER CALLED STATING THAT THE SUBJECT WAS WALKING AROUND THE HOME CARRYING A KITCHEN KNIFE.
OFFICERS HAD RESPONDED THE NIGHT PRIOR BECAUSE THE SAME SUBJECT WAS ON THE ROOF WITH A KITCHEN
KNIFE BECAUSE HE BELIEVED UNIDENTIFIED MEN WERE WALKING AROUND HIS HOME WITH FIREARMS. THE FATHER
FELT THAT THIS SUBJECT WAS A THREAT TO THE PUBLIC.

SUBJECT FREQUENTLY CALLS DISPATCH REQUESTING AN OFFICER AND AT THE SAME TIME MAKES STATEMENTS THAT OFFICERS AND DISPATCHERS ARE EVIL. ON THIS DATE HE STATED THAT GOD WANTS HIM TO DO SOMETHING EVIL AT THE COORS SUBSTATION ON MONDAY. DID STATE TO ME THAT HE ATTEMPTED TO PURCHASE A GUN AT WALMART AND GOD INSTRUCTED HIM TO PURCHASE A GUN FROM TWO MEN.


THE SUBJECT REPEATEDLY STATED THAT HE HATES POLICE OFFICERS, AND THAT HE WOULD FIGHT OFFICERS IN THE FUTURE. THE SUBJECT WAS ARMED WITH TWO KNIVES WHEN OFFICERS FIRST MADE CONTACT WITH HIM. THE SUBJECT STATED HIS ANGER TOWARDS POLICE COMES FROM HAVING HAD FRIENDS KILLED IN OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTINGS.

SUBJECT IS EXTREMELY DANGEROUS, AND CARRIES MULTIPLE KNIVES. SUBJECT DISOBEYED ORDERS TO PUT HIS HANDS BEHIND HIS BACK; INSTEAD, SUBJECT MADE A SUDDEN MOTION TO REMOVE A KNIFE FROM BEHIND HIS BACK. THOUGH HE DROPPED THE KNIFE IMMEDIATELY, SUBJECT YELLED AND SCREAMED THAT HE WANTED TO FIGHT WITH POLICE OFFICERS. MOREOVER, SUBJECT HAD SEVERAL MORE KNIVES IN HIS CAR AND MOTORCYCLE.


Reason For Contact Provided On The 4,000 CIT Worksheets Completed Between November 2017 and April 2018




Disposition Of The Encounter Provided On The 4,000 CIT Worksheets Completed Between November 2017 and April 2018




Was There A Mental Health Transport Provided On The 4,000 CIT Worksheets Completed Between November 2017 and April 2018




If There Was A Mental Health Transport, Where Did It Go?




If There Was A Mental Health Transport, Who Provide The Transport?
