#### A. Case #2022- 1 Heritage Defender LEDA

#### **Findings:**

- 1. LEDA 22-1 is a qualified project as defined by the State's Local Economic Development Act and the City enabling legislation (F/S O-04-10);
- 2. LEDA 22-1 would make positive substantive contributions to the local economy and

- community by creating 15 base jobs;
- 3. Subject to the development of acceptable security documents, LEDA 22-1 would comply with the adopted City plans and policies, and meet community economic development priorities and objectives, including remaining in operation for 10 years; and
- 4. Subject to the development of acceptable security documents, LEDA 22-1 would adequately meet the evaluation criteria established by the City for Local Economic Development Act projects, including the requirement that the City recoup the value of its investment within 10 years.

#### B. Case #2022 - 2 Agenda LLC LEDA

#### **Findings:**

- 1. LEDA 22-2 is a qualified project as defined by the State's Local Economic Development Act and the City enabling legislation (F/S O-04-10);
- 2. LEDA 22-2 would make positive substantive contributions to the local economy and community by creating 15 base jobs;
- 3. Subject to the development of acceptable security documents, LEDA 22-2 would comply with the adopted City plans and policies, and meet community economic development priorities and objectives, including remaining in operation for 10 years; and
- 4. Subject to the development of acceptable security documents, LEDA 22-2 would adequately meet the evaluation criteria established by the City for Local Economic Development Act.

## C. Case # 2022-3 IRB Heritage and Agenda

#### **Findings:**

- 1. IRB 22- is a qualified project as defined by the State's Industrial Revenue Bond Act and the City enabling legislation (Resolution R-196, Sixth Council (126-1985) as amended by Resolution 350 Sixth Council;
- 2. IRB 22-1would make positive substantive contributions to the local economy and community by creating 35 jobs;
- 3. IRB 22-1will continue the company's expansion and creation of new high-paying jobs in Albuquerque;
- 4. IRB 22-1would comply with the adopted City plans and policies, and meet community economic development priorities and objectives; and
- 5. IRB 22-1would adequately meet the evaluation criteria established by the City for Industrial Revenue Bond Act projects, including the requirement that the City recoup the value of its investment over the term of the bonds.
