Asian Experience / Tiger Habitat	\$1,750,000 Design, construct, renovate, equip and purchase related furnishings and equipment for Asian exhibits and related public facilities. Priorities for this project are renovation of the tiger and elephant exhibits to bring them into compliance with AZA/USDA standards. Other aspects of this project may include creation/renovation of habitats for takins and bactrian camel.
Japanese Garden / Sasebo Exhibition	\$750,000 Design, construct, equip, acquire plants, electronic irrigation equipment and specialized garden art. Complete construction of the Japanese garden. The garden will show the parallel cultures in architecture and landscapes to those of the southwest, strengthening the information about different cultures for all citizens.
Renovation and Repair (BioPark)	\$500,000 To design, construct, equip, furnish, and renovate current facilities, including utilities, public amenities, electronic equipment, landscaping, life support systems and animal enclosures. Remodel existing out-dated facilities at BioPark. The purpose of this project is to achieve/maintain standards mandated by the American Zoo's and Aquariums (AZA) and USDA that must be met.
Tingley Beach, Phase II	\$975,000 Design, construct, equip, and purchase related equipment, including vegetation to enhance and complete unfinished portions of Tingley Beach. Complete walkways, signage, lighting, picnic areas, fencing and shade structures.
Albuquerque Museum Development	\$200,000 Design and construction of the Albuquerque Museum of Art and History and purchase related equipment, rehabilitation addresses aging systems and structure, ADA and egress issues, and overcrowded spaces for educational programs, history exhibitions and administrative offices.
South Broadway Cultural Center	\$100,000 Design and construction services in order to rehabilitate the South Broadway Cultural Center.
