Background

PURPOSE

The overall purpose is to develop a centralized Special Operations training and Deployment facility to serve the City of Albuquerque Special Operations Division within Albuquerque Fire Rescue. This facility will become the training and deployment site for our statewide HAZMAT, Wildland, and Heavy Technical Rescue Teams., Although primarily a City of Albuquerque facility, it can serve as a centralized training site for other neighboring police and fire agencies including, but not limited to the following organizations: BCFR, RRRFR, VCFR, APD, BCSO, National Wildfire Coordination Group, New Mexico Homeland Security, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of Transportation, New Mexico State Police, Municipal and Regional Rescue teams.

The facility will also create a private and secure staging grounds for appropriate agencies during regional incidents. Having the proper space and equipment at a permanent location allows for more agencies to effectively coordinate during these incidents. For large regional incidents, such as the recent Hermits Peak Fire, this facility could accommodate use by Federal assets to coordinate the operational portion of their response. Additional benefits include a conference room that can also serve as a place to hold multi-agency coordination meetings during times of disaster.
