Background

Albuquerque Fire and Rescue faces ongoing facility and equipment needs, including updates to existing stations, external infrastructure repairs, and new construction to meet growing needs. The facilities needs include:

Fire Station 12 \$7.5 Million

Fire Station 12, when remodeled and built out, will be a 4-bay station to serve one of the busiest parts of the City. Over 25% of AFR's call volume is in SE Albuquerque and that number has continued to rise. This funding will add critical resources, including apparatus, to the meet the needs of the southeast part of the City.

Mesa del Sol Fire Station \$12 Million

The Mesa del Sol community is growing, and with that growth, is in need of fire and EMS services. That was never more evident than when this summer, a massive fire demonstrated the need for additional resources in the Mesa del Sol area. This funding request is for the construction and equipping of a 3-bay fire station in Mesa del Sol in Albuquerque.

Coronado Park Fire Rescue Training and Response Center \$5 Million

This funding would support continued efforts to remodel Fire Station 4, which stands adjacent to Coronado Park, and establish a training facility. This would become a training facility for first responders, and a deployment site for AFR statewide HAZMAT, Wildland, and Heavy Technical Rescue Teams.
