## CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE'S 2024 CAPITAL PRIORITIES

## Background

This funding request will provide additional overnight capacity for 200 individuals each night, and enable much-needed renovations at current facilities for individuals, families, and patients unhoused by physical health or economic issues, while providing resources to allow them to recover their previous lives or make a new start.

The City of Albuquerque has seen success with a 90-day model with on-site case management and support from other agencies. Since opening in December 2020, the Family Housing Navigation Center has housed over 1,100 people or 352 families. This funding would allow the City to construct, rehabilitate, equip, and furnish additional spaces within the City of Albuquerque to expand this model.

In Albuquerque, a January Point-in-Time Count taken by community partners showed a total of 2,394 individuals experiencing homelessness, with 35% of those individuals coming to Albuquerque from other parts of New Mexico.

Overnight beds with case management individually support guests toward housing or other necessary supportive services. On-site supportive services and multi-agency coordination significantly improves clients' abilities to work on issues preventing them from achieving stable housing. City Housing Navigation Centers work to help individuals and families exit into stable housing in 90 days.

Capital funding will be used to expand existing facilities to serve 200 additional individuals per day, or 800 additional people per year.
