5. Commission Administrative Matters

a. CABQ Native American Affairs Liaison, **Terry Sloan**, CABQ Intergovernmental Tribal Liaison and **Dawn Begay**, Native American Affairs Coordinator report updates.

Dawn Begay reports:

- Reports on the city budget and support and recognizing the need for the Office of Equity and Inclusion. It was funded through a Kellogg grant with the intent that positions would be transitioned into permanent city positions. Next consideration is tribal liaison position which will continue to be contracted position until it phases into a full-time permanent position. The commission will be able to submit issue papers for recommendations of positions to be full-time, permanent positions in November/December. In May city council will review. The goal is to create operational sustainability. The Kellogg grant funded many components in events and sponsored activities.
- Gateway Center has been contracting for outside services. UNM students developed a GAP analysis and still looking for city partnership. The Center is considering culturally based and appropriate services for the Indigenous population, as well as, introducing cultural care education for the city or service providers.
- City accountability and follow-up of commitments with MMIW multi-media campaign, a tribal summit, MMIW space at the Gateway Center. An action plan will determine who is responsible for contact and oversight.
- Living city grant (\$75,000) to assist in a springboard to housing development program for people of color. It is hoped that a housing justice summit will occur in the fall or a housing needs assessment. The Housing Justice Taskforce will start soon.
