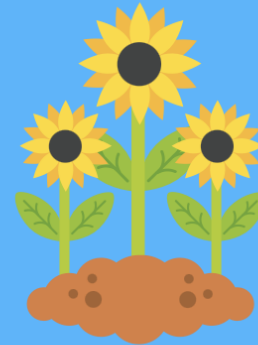

The City of Albuquerque Division of Parks and Recreation is awarding between \$500-\$15,000 to support garden sites in Albuquerque, NM. Garden projects can include funding for infrastructure (i.e. irrigation, shade structure, hoop houses), gardening supplies, garden design, and implementation. Grant applications are due by May 9th, 2022. We will let grant applicants know whether their application has been accepted by May 15th, 2022.
