Spring Comes to Albuquerque

In April, the Sandia Foothills Open Space cleanup (page 2) will kick-off another year of outdoor volunteerism. There is a contagious enthusiasm when you gather early on a Saturday morning with neighbors and fellow trail users to work on projects that will benefit our Major Public Open Space areas. The activities typically include trail maintenance, trash pickup and graffiti removal. Each Saturday during April, volunteers will be getting together at a different foothill location to lend a hand in cleaning up and preserving the trails that are used by so many residents of Albuquerque. Sustaining the outstanding quality of our

open space areas is a tribute to the loyal and dedicated volunteer participation. This intimate experience with the city's landscapes is repeated three more times each year as part of the Open Space Division's annual volunteer events.

In May, the National River Cleanup Day (see page 2 for more information) is held and volunteers focus their efforts along the Rio Grande. Last year was a tremendous success as volunteers collected an estimated 900 pounds of garbage from the Bosque and river. In June, the annual National Trails Day event will take place. The focus for volunteers is maintaining trails within the Sandia Foothills Open Space areas and the Sandia Mountain Wilderness. Volunteer turnout is always exceptional for this event. We expect bigger crowds than ever, and we're making a special petition to all supporters of Open Space to consider giving an extra donation to the Alliance in support of National Trails Day. Please see page 3 for more information. Finally, the Dia del Rio Celebration is held annually in mid-October. The attention is given to the Rio Grande and the Bosque as volunteers work to improve one of our most vital resources.

These community efforts are an important element in the stewardship of Albuquerque's Open Space land, and all of the events draw large numbers of volunteers. Such strong community participation is exactly what is needed to protect and preserve all of our favorite Open Space areas. A Generous Donation: A Tribute to Arbon Lang

Take a 10 megapixel digital camera and what do you get? Typically you get a high quality photograph. Now take that same digital camera, attach it to a robot that takes hundreds, even thousands of photos for one scene, stitches them together seamlessly, and you get the emergence of the **gigapixel**. A gigapixel is **1,000 megapixels**. This high tech machine is called GigaPan and was created in collaboration with NASA, Carnegie Mellon, and Google. It is not very often you see one of these machines but it is even less likely that someone will just give their GigaPan away for free. Open Space expressed an interest in the GigaPan robot after local Albuquerque resident and photographer **Arbon Lang** demonstrated the GigaPan Epic 100 system at the Open Space Visitor Center. Mr. Lang donated the robot, all accessories, a tripod, multiple books on photography, and some beautiful photos he has taken of the Open Space with the GigaPan.


***Encaustic Demonstration with Harriette Tsosie

More Wild Turkey, Please...

As many of you know, the Pueblo of Sandia recently reintroduced wild turkeys back to Pueblo lands. Part of this grant is to trap and release 40 feral turkeys. (Please see Volume 10, Issue 3 of Open Space News.) Open Space volunteers are encouraged to help in this reintroduction project by reporting any turkey sightings to **Mr. Smith at 867-4533, Monday – Friday, 8 – 5, or 934-8636** during weekends, or by email at tsmith@sandiapueblo.nsn.us

Please include the following information:

- Give a brief description of the bird including the gender, color of leg band, and number on leg band if you can see it.
- Is there a radio transmitter?
- The number of turkeys spotted
- Time of day.
- Location where spotted.

Also, please keep these items in mind:

- Do not feed these turkeys otherwise they will become dependant on humans.
- Do not bother turkeys in their roosting area.
- Please do not bother or handle baby turkeys (known as Poults).
- If possible please photograph any turkeys that are spotted.

Thank you for your assistance and cooperation in this matter and have fun looking for turkeys in areas where you thought you would never see them before.
