A Message from the Open Space Alliance

Hello supporters of Albuquerque Open Space! The Alliance, the Friends group for the Open Space Division, had a busy January. As the new beginning of our fiscal year, there was an election of the 2013 Board of Directors. This took place at the Annual Meeting of the Alliance on January 26th. We were privileged to have Barry Kirk, the videographer for the documentary film about environmentalist Aldo Leopold, *Green Fire*, as our presenter. He shared his sense of connectedness with Aldo Leopold in New Mexico and then showed the film.



The Alliance also had a Goal Setting day. Thanks to the assistance of Tim Karpoff, goals were established for 2013 and also three-year goals for 2016. These goals are posted on our website, www.openspacealliance.org. Planning for a gift shop at the Open Space Visitor Center is almost underway as we near completion of an Agreement with the City of Albuquerque. More about this in future.





Update on Open Space Visitor Center Improvements

In early March, the Visitor Center closed for the first in a series of upgrades. These include taking out the asphalt driveway and installing permeable concrete pavers for better drainage, renovating the patio and putting in a shade structure, and making repairs to the floor inside the building.

Although the Visitor Center is expected to reopen by April 5th following the driveway renovation, the rest of these upgrades will take place over a number of months, possibly into the summer.

The patio was built over an old swimming pool; its concrete decking has cracked and the brick fill is settling and warping. Builders will remove the entire patio, compact the ground underneath for greater stability, and lay new concrete and brick. In conjunction with this project, the builders will erect a shade structure. This structure will extend over the southern portion of the patio, providing visitors even more comfort during the hottest months.

Finally, a new floor with decorative colored patterns will grace the lobby and halls of the OSVC building by the end of this summer. Stay tuned! We will send along periodic updates as each of these projects advances.

2013 RIVER CLEANUP ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Community *bosque* cleanup at the Central Avenue Bridge:** Cleanup activities for all ages in the bosque along the Central Avenue Bridge including trash pickup and graffiti removal.
- 2. Organize your own *bosque* Cleanup:** Have a favorite area of the bosque? Consider hosting a cleanup of your own! The Open Space Division will supply trash bags and dispose of the collected trash. Those wishing to organize a cleanup must contact the Open Space Division at 452-5200 or email kswanson@cabq.gov.
- 3. Clean the River in a Guided Raft:** On the day of the event, Kirtland Outdoor Recreation will provide a limited number of guided rafts that help remove trash from the river starting from the Montañito Bridge and finishing at Central. Rafts are on a first come first serve basis and space is limited. Arrive early at the Central Avenue Bridge to reserve a space on the rafts. Children 7 years and older may ride on the rafts, but children under 18 must have a parent/guardian (at least one parent per 4 children) with them.
- 4. Clean the river in your own boat:** Call the Open Space Division at 452-5200 or email kswanson@cabq.gov for more information. People with their own rafts, kayaks, and canoes are encouraged to clean up the river on this day. You must provide your own transportation and shuttle for your boat. The Open Space Division will provide you with trash bags and will dispose of the collected trash.
