#### 1-35-1 **Purpose**

It is the purpose of this policy to provide the Crime Scene Specialist (CSS) Unit CSS to with procedures on how to-recognize, identify, and collect forensically-significant evidence at crime scenes.

#### 1-35-2 Policy

It is the policy of the <u>Albuquerque Police Department (Department)</u> to have <u>the Crime Scene Specialists (CSS) S-Unit personnel</u> properly <u>to-collect</u>, preserve, and recognize evidence <u>ion</u> a timely <u>basis manner by</u>, following approved procedures. -Procedures <u>will shall</u> be updated based on court decisions about rules of evidence, the latest technology available, and best practices.

<u>A A Department civilian employee employee charged with the who is responsible for ility of recognizing, collecting, and preserving all forensically-significant evidence at crime scenes and the properly submitting ssion of that evidence to Scientific Evidence Division (SED) personnel for analysis.</u>

#### B. Life-threatening Injury

Any injury that involves serious, physical harm that may result in significant or permanent disfigurement or the loss of a major bodily organ or function, including, but not limited to, the loss of a limb, paralysis, or the loss of eyesight; that may necessitate medical or surgical intervention to prevent permanent impairment; that could potentially cause a significant reduction in the quality of life; or that has the likelihood of causing death.

#### C. Serious Crimes Call-Out

A serious crimes call-out is generated when an individual sustains a life-threatening injury that creates a substantial risk of death, or that causes death or serious and protracted disfigurement, or causes impairment of the function of any bodily organ or limb.

### 1-35-4 Duties and Responsibilities

#### A. Criminalistics Lieutenant

- 1. The Crime Scene Investigations Section Lieutenant will shall report to the Commander of the SED.
- 2. The Crime Scene Investigations Section Lieutenant will shall have supervisory responsibility for the CSS Unit supervisors, Property Crime Reporting Technician supervisors, the Major Crime Scene Team (MCST) Sergeant and the Photo Lab Forensic Photography Unit supervisor.

#### B. Crime Scene Specialist Unit Supervisor

- 1. The CSS <u>Unit</u> supervisors <u>will</u> report directly to the <u>Crime Scene</u> <u>Investigations Section</u> <u>Criminalistics</u> Lieutenant.
- 2. The CSS <u>Unit</u> supervisor's primary responsibility is to ensure the services delivered by the CSS Unit are of the highest possible quality.
- 3. The CSS <u>Unit</u> supervisors <u>will</u> shall maintain quality control by regularly monitoring their personnel.

- b. <u>The supervisor conducts a</u>A regular, formal inspection of personnel, vehicles, and CSS <u>Unit</u> equipment.
  - i. CSS <u>Unit and vehicles shall will</u> be inspected monthly.
  - ii. Vehicle inspection forms <u>will shall</u> be forwarded to the Crime Scene Investigation Section Lieutenant each month.
  - iii. Repair and maintenance of CSS <u>Unit</u> equipment <u>shall</u> be coordinated through appropriate SED personnel.

#### C. Crime Scene Specialist (CSS)

- 1. <u>The CSS\_members will-shall</u> work shift hours that fulfill the needs of the section to provide the most efficient coverage of calls on a Ceity-wide basis.
- 2. The CSS's dDuty hours will shall be flexible to meet the needs of the Ddepartment.
- 3. <u>The CSS members will shall respond to violent crimes first, property crimes second, and administrative assignments third.</u>
- 4. At the request of the Emergency Communications Center (ECC), CSS <u>Unit</u> members will personnel shall respond to crime scenes involving including, but not <u>limited to</u>, the following, although <u>but not limited to</u>:
  - a. Unexpected deaths that are unnatural in nature;
  - a.b. or Serious injury calls;
  - b.c. Armed robberies;
  - c.d. Criminal sexual penetration crimes;
  - d.e. \_\_\_\_Discharge of duty weapon Department-issued weapon, except for training purposes;
  - e.f. Fatal and serious injury crashes;
  - g. Domestic violence calls;
  - h. Property crimes;
  - i. All levels of use of force and shows of force calls, consistent with SOP Use of Force—Review and Investigation by Department Personnel;
  - Gunshot detection system follow-up canvasses, consistent with SOP Gunshot Detection Procedure;
  - k. Homicides:
  - f.l. All felonies involving forensically-significant evidence; and
  - g.m. Any crime scene, aAs requested by Department SED supervisorspersonnel.
- 5. <u>The CSS shall aAssist patrol officers Field Services Bureau (FSB) sworn personnel,</u> or detectives from other units, to identify crime characteristics or special circumstances that exist.

- 6. <u>The CSS shall aAssist other federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies ason approvedal of by the CSS Unit supervisor.</u>
- 7. The CSS shall a Assist and for train personnel in crime scene procedures.
- 8. The CSS shall aAssist the Major Crime Scene Team MCST at crime scenes, as required.
  - a. The CSS shall identify the inner crime scene perimeter and secure it with red crime scene tape.

- Monitor radio calls while at crime scenes to assure availability in case of emergency situations.
- 10.9. If a Field Services sworn sSupervisor is unavailable, the CSS will shall respond for the purpose of photographing the alleged injuries of all sworn personnel officers, suspects, and/or prisoners involved in resistance in any manner which would require a Level 1 use of force report, consistent with SOP Use of Force—Review and Investigation by Department Personnel.
- 11.10. The CSS will shall maintain a weekly and monthly worksheet.
- 12.11. The CSS\_willshall write Uniform Incident Reports and Supplemental Reports on all CSS\_Unit calls for service when evidence is collected. If evidence is not collected, the CSS\_Unit personnel will\_shall\_notify the officer\_sworn personnel taking the initial report to reference in their his/her report that no evidence was collected. The CSS\_Unit personnel will\_shall also add remarks to their call indicating whether or not evidence was collected and what type of evidence.

## 6 1-35-5 Rules and Procedures

- A. CSS <u>Unit</u> personnel <u>shall</u> follow all guidelines in SOP –Collection, Submission, and Disposition of Evidence and Property.
- B. Use of Evidence Storage Lockers:
  - The CSS Unit shall p-rovide twenty-four (24)-hour evidence storage.; Eevidence storage lockers are provided in the triage room of the Metropolitan Forensic Science Center (MFSC or, "Crime Lab").
  - 2. <u>The CSS\_will\_shall\_fill</u> out the evidence <u>storage locker\_logbook</u> also located in the MFSC triage room.

- The CSS shall place aAll items of evidence, confiscated property, and found items will be placed in the triage room evidence storage lockers at the MFSC by the end of their shift.
- 4. The CSS is responsible for collecting evidence, property, or found items and is will be held responsible for the proper preservation and safeguarding of evidence until it has been turned into the MFSC triage room.
- 5. Only items of evidence that physically fit into the locker should be deposited. Any items that do not fit in the locker shall be placed in the triage room.
- 6. To facilitate special needs during closed hours, the <a href="ECCCommunications Sections shallwill"><u>ECCCommunications Sections Sections shallwill</u></a> have a call-out list of Evidence/<a href="Disposition Unit personnel who are on-call."><u>Disposition Unit personnel who are on-call.</u></a>
- 7. Evidence deposited in the evidence storage locker shall will be tagged properly.
- 8. CSS <u>Unit personnel</u> and <u>Evidence Room</u> <u>Evidence/Disposition Unit</u>-personnel <u>shallwill</u> <u>enter into the evidence management system the evidence that is deposited and retrieved complete the evidence log upon each deposit and retrieval of evidence from the evidence storage locker.</u>
- C. Dispatching the Crime Scene Specialist UnitSS C.
  - 1. CSS will be dispatched to:
    - a. Homicides;
    - b. Unexpected or unnatural deaths; and
    - c. All felonies involving forensically significant evidence.
  - 2.1. CSS <u>Unit personnel calls</u> (10-64) <u>shall</u> be prioritized using the following guidelines:
    - a. Priority 6: —Fatal vehicle crashes; juvenile calls with serious injury; and vViolent crimes resulting in great bodily injury or death, which is required to and needed to determine whether if a Major Crime Scene Team (MCST) Serious Crimes callout is needed.
    - b. Priority 7: Unless there is an articulable reason for deviation, or as directed by an SED supervisor, the following calls should be dispatched in the listed order:

       Violent crime (aggravated battery) which will not result in an MCST call- out, suicides, suspicious unattended/unexpected deaths.
      - i. Gunshot detection (ShotSpotter);
      - ii. Serious iniurv:
      - iii. Use of force:
      - iv. Show of force:
      - v. Criminal sexual penetration;
      - vi. Juvenile calls without serious injury;
      - vii. Suicide;

- viii. Domestic violence;
- ix. Unattended or unexpected death;
- x. Felonies involving evidence collection; and
- b.xi. Property crime.
- c. Priority 8 Calls where an officer is standing by (use of force, recovered stolen vehicle, domestic violence, etc.).
- d.c. Priority 8:
  - i. Processing a warrant;
  - <u>ii.</u> Accidental discharge of a weapon or intermediate weapon system by sworn personnel; and
  - iiii. Photo call only or comments are left when an officer leaves the scene.
- e.2. If there is only one CSS in service on duty, that CSS will shall not be dispatched to a burglary property crime call.
  - <u>i.a.</u> CSS <u>Unit personnel</u> should not be dispatched on primary calls if there is <u>no</u> offender information <u>(i.e., name and date of birth)</u>.
  - <u>b.</u> CSS <u>Unit personnel</u> should not be dispatched to any <u>burglary property crime</u> where the possibility exists that an offender may still be present, the location has a direct hazard, or other unsafe situations exist.
- g. CSS <u>Unit personnel</u> <u>will-shall</u> not clear for lunch or log off if a 10-64, <u>P</u>priority 6 or <u>Priority</u> 7 call is holding, unless cleared by their supervisor.

  - h.a. CSS <u>Unit personnel will shall</u> not log a lunch break during the last hour of their shift without supervisor approval.
- 3.4. When a CSS <u>Unit personnel areis</u> dispatched to a call the <u>y-personnel CSS</u> believes to be inappropriate,; the <u>CSS</u>they shall will try to resolve the matter through their chain of command.
- 4.5. A-CSS <u>Unit personnel shall will</u> notify the on-duty CSS <u>Unit</u> supervisor or <u>SED</u> <u>supervisor</u> <del>Sergeant by radio or cell phone</del> on the nature of the following calls:
  - a. Homicide;
  - b. Suicide;
  - c. Shootings;
  - c.d. Sstabbings;
  - d.e. All Department personnel (sworn and civilian) injured or killed;
  - e.f. A request for service by outside agencies;
  - f.g. Child abuse calls; and
  - g.h. Any call potentially that may be widely of a potentially sensational publicized. nature.

- The CSS <u>Unit personnel</u> training program <u>will-shall</u> expand the knowledge of evidence procedures in the areas of all of the forensic disciplines provided by the SED.
- 2. Training will shall be implemented where needed to ensure a high level of expertise among CSS Unit personnel.

- 3. Supervisors assigned to the SED <u>will\_shall\_identify</u> areas where individual personnel need improvement to maintain the highest proficiency.

- 4. Training will shall be implemented to improve skills as needed.

- 5. SED personnel <u>will\_shall\_provide</u> on-the-job training, as needed, for <u>individuals</u>new CSS Unit personnel.



- 6. Refresher courses <u>will\_shall\_be</u> provided to all CSS <u>Unit\_personnel</u> as a means of maintaining overall proficiency.
- E. Due to the possibility of significant <u>psychological</u> trauma caused by the investigation of violent crimes, CSS <u>Unit</u> personnel shall attend a Behavioral <del>Health</del> <del>Wellness</del>Sciences Section (BSS) appointment biannually.
