 - 6. Log and review all incoming Uniform Incident Reports of missing or assumed missing persons in the Missing Person Unit's internal case management system;
 - 7. Conduct follow-up investigation to determine whether the missing person has returned or is still missing;
 - a. If the person is still missing, the Missing Persons Unit Detective shall continue to investigate and leave the case open until the individual is located.
 - b. If the person has been found, the Missing Persons Unit Detective shall ensure the individual is removed from NCIC and the case is closed.
 - 8. Provide training to Department personnel and other agencies as directed; and
 - 9. Assist in the maintenance of the NamUS database, which is managed by Cold Case Unit personnel.
