POLICY:

Department policy is to identify cases involving habitual or serious offenders, and establish criteria for handling such cases. All cases in which habitual or serious offenders are involved will be designated as such and referred to the District Attorney's office. Investigators are encouraged to request assistance from the District Attorney's office in the preparation of these cases when appropriate.

RULES AND PROCEDURES:

2-03-1 CASE/INCIDENT REFERRAL CRITERIA

A case/incident shall be referred to the District Attorney's office when the suspect is under arrest for the commission or attempted commission of the following offenses:

- A. Robbery for three or more separate robbery offenses not arising out of the same action.
- B. Robbery, and if, during the past ten years, exclusive of any time spent in prison, the suspect has been tried and convicted of any one of the following:

Robbery, armed with a deadly weapon Burglary, (residential, commercial or aggravated) Arson Criminal Sexual Penetration Kidnapping for robbery or ransom Murder

or, any combination of two of the following:

2. Grand Larceny

Auto Theft

Receiving stolen property

Robbery

Burglary

Kidnapping

Aggravated assault - Aggravated Battery

Possession with intent to distribute controlled substance

Trafficking controlled substance
