RECOMMENDATION

DATE SUBMITTED:	Seven (7) business days after submission
RECEIPT DUE:	Twenty (20) business days after submission
APD RESPONSE DUE:	Sixty (60) business days after submission

RATIONALE:

Teenagers, as new drivers, are an at-risk group due to inexperience and youthful exuberance. They especially need guidance in understanding what to do if pulled over by a police officer, so it seems logical to try and educate them in as many ways as possible. Two obvious ways are in the high schools and through driver training schools.

Recently the Valley Area Command Community Policing Council (VACCPC) has made a Recommendation of incorporating information on "Encounters With the Police" in the New Mexico Drivers Handbook and questions on that topic included in the written test for drivers. As a follow-up to their suggestion, and as a further way to build on community policing principles and promote constitutional policing, we submit the following recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION:

We, the Northeast Area Command Community Policing Council, recommend to Chief Gorden E. Eden, Jr., and the Albuquerque Police Department:

(a) that the APD Officers assigned to APS Public High Schools, charter schools, and private high schools in Albuquerque work with the administrations of the schools and any APS Officers assigned to them to inform all students old enough to prepare for drivers licenses about the contents of the APD brochure entitled <u>"What Should I Do If I Am Stopped</u> <u>By A Police Officer?</u>";

(b) that each high school, public, private and charter, be requested to post a link to that brochure on its website for parents to access;

(c) that the driver training schools in Albuquerque (as stakeholders in community safety) be provided with the brochures to incorporate into their training;

(d) and that the Chief ask the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office to join forces with APD in this effort to inform students.

What should I do if I am stopped by a police officer?

PULL OVER IMMEDIATELY

*Pull off to the right side of the roadway and position your vehicle as far out of the traffic lane as possible.

*Turn off your engine and any audio devices (radio, CD player, cell phone) and roll down your window so you can communicate with the officer.

*If the stop takes place in the dark, turn on your emergency flashers and the vehicle's interior lights so that the officer can easily see inside

*Ask the officer for identification if he is not in uniform or if his patrol vehicle does not have official law enforcement markings.

REMAIN CALM

*Remain calm and ask all passengers to remain quiet and calm as well.

*Keep your seat belt fastened and ask your passengers to do the same.

*Stay in your seat and do not get out of the vehicle unless the officer asks you to.

HANDS IN PLAIN VIEW

*Keep your hands in plain view, preferably on the steering wheel. Ask your passengers to keep their hands in plain view or on their laps.

*Do not make any suspicious movements such as reaching under the seat or dash-board. The officer might think that you are trying to hide or are searching for some-thing.

WEAPONS POSSESSION

* Let the officer know if you are carrying a weapon in your car or on your person. Tell the officer if you have a concealed carry nearest.

* A pat down search may be performed. This is done if the officer believes that you might be carrying anything that may jeopar dize his safety.

Do not be surprised if another patrol car appears. This is only to assure the safety of all parties involved.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

*The officer will ask for your driver's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance.

*Tell the officer where these documents are located and reach for them slowly, keeping one hand on the steering wheel.

COMMUNICATE CLEARLY

*Answer the officer's questions fully and clearly.

*If you disagree with the officer, do not discuss your point of view during the traffic stop. You will be given the opportunity to do this in court.

*The citation will show the date and location of your court date.

OBEY THE GOLDEN RULE

*Treat the officer like you would want to be treated and the officer will respond in kind.

TRAFFIC CITATIONS

* If the reason for the citation is not clear, ask the officer for an explanation in a re-spectful manner.

* If the officer gives you a citation you will be asked to sign it. Your signature is not an admission of guilt. It only means that you acknowledge receiving the citation.

* If you refuse to sign the citation you will be

FOLLOW UP

* If you believe the officer acted improperly, document the interaction and then call the APD Internal Affairs Unit at (505) 768-2880. You may also file a complaint online at www. cabq.gov/iro

* If you have any questions about the laws of New Mexico, consult an attorney or a law enforcement officer who is familiar with the traffic code.

INMEDIATAMENTE

*Si el oficial de policia no esta uniformado o si la patrulla (carro del policia) no cuenta con un logo que lo identifique con el departamento de policias, pidale un documento de identificación.

DETENGASE Y ESTACIONESE

*Estacione a la derecha de la via y ubique su vehículo lo mas lejos del trafico que pueda.

Apague su motor y cualquier equipo de sonido

(radio, cellular,etc) y baje la ventana de su vehí-culo para comunicarse con el oficial de policía.

MANTENGA LA CALMA

Mantenga la calma y pidale a los pasajeros que lo acompañan que mantengan la calma también.

Mantenga el cinturón de seguridad abrochado y pidale a los pasajeros que hagan lo mismo.

 Manténgase sentado en su sitio y no salga del vehículo al menos que el oficial de policía se lo nida

MANOS A LA VISTA

•Mantenga sus manos a la vista y preferible-mente en el timón. Pídale a los pasajeros que lo acompañan que pongan las manos encima de las piernas

 No haga ningún movimiento sospechoso como pretender agarrar algo debajo del asiento o en la guantera. El oficial de policía podría pensar que usted esta tratando de esconder o alcanzar

POSESION DE ARMAS

* Déjele saber al oficial de polícia si tiene un arma. Comuniquele al oficial si cuenta con un permiso para portaria.

* El oficial le podría realizar un palpado si es que este piensa que usted carga algo que puede atentar contra su seguridad.

* No se sorprenda si otro vehículo policial aparece en la escena. Esto pasa solo para resguar-dar la seguridad de ambas partes.

PEDIDO DE DOCUMENTOS

*El oficial le preguntara por su licencia de conducir, la prueba de registro del vehículo y la prueba de seguro (aseguránza).

*Digale al oficial en que parte del auto tiene es-tos documentos y búsquelos con calma mante-niendo una mano en el timón del vehículo.

COMUNICACION CLARA

*Conteste todas las preguntas que le hace el oficial de manera clara y veraz.

*Si usted no esta de acuerdo con el oficial, no discuta su punto de vista durante esta deten-ción. Usted tendrá la oportunidad de discutir la situación en detalle en la corte.

*La citación indicara la fecha y el lugar de la donde puede acudi

TRATE A OTROS COMO QUISIERA SER TRATADO

*Trate al oficial de policia como usted quisiera que lo traten, así el oficial le responderá de manera amable.

INFRACCION DE TRAFICO

*Si la razón de la infracción no es del todo clara, pregunte al oficial de policía, con respeto, por una explicación mas detallada.

Si el oficial le pone una infracción le pedirá que la firme. Su firma no asegura necesariamente su culpa o responsabilidad, solo indica que usted tiene conocimiento de la infracción que le han puesto
