Mr. Riordan began his legal career in 1968, as a Legal Aid Attorney with the Legal Aid Society. From 1969 thru 1971, Mr. Riordan served as an Assistant District Attorney in Bernalillo County. After leaving the District Attorney's Office, Mr. Riordan was in private practice from 1972 to 1978, when he was selected by the Second District Judiciary to serve as the Children's Court Judge.

In 1980, Mr. Riordan was elected to the New Mexico Supreme Court. In 1986, Mr. Riordan was elected by the remaining Justices of the court to serve as Chief Justice.

From 1987 to 1993 Mr. Riordan returned to private practice. From 1987 to 1990, Mr. Riordan served as the first Independent Counsel for the City of Albuquerque

he was responsible for reviewing internal affairs investigations into allegations of misconduct by members of the Albuquerque Police Department.

Since 1992, Mr. Riordan has developed a dynamic mediation \ arbitration practice assisting opposing parties to reach an amicable and mutually beneficial dispute resolution and avoiding protracted litigation.
