APD Releases Details of Recent Officer-Involved Shootings

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – The Albuquerque Police Department released details today of recent officer-involved shootings.

Oct. 14, 2019 – 425 Tennessee St NE

Summary of incident:

- Officers were dispatched at 2:01 a.m. to a domestic violence call after the caller said he received a text message from a friend stating her ex-boyfriend was at her apartment and threatening her with a gun.
- Dispatchers were not able to make contact with the person who sent the text message, and several officers arrived on scene.
- An officer observed through a window a male pointing a gun at the back of a female's head. Officers made contact with the male at the front door. He was still armed and refused to follow commands and went back inside the apartment.
- Officers determined the female appeared to be in distress and established a perimeter and attempted negotiations with the occupants.
- The female called 911 and said she did not know why officers were there. She claimed to be alone and did not want to talk to officers.
- Based on the subjects not exiting the apartment and reliable information that the male was holding the female against her will, a tactical activation was initiated.
- The Crisis Negotiation Team began communicating with the male. At the same time, officers discovered the male had active felony warrants for his arrest relating to sex offenses.
- As negotiations failed, and the female was still believed to be under duress,
 SWAT officers created a hostage rescue plan and made entry into the apartment.
- Upon entry, officers reported the male had a two-handed grip on the gun, which he was pointing at officers as he stood in the hallway. Officers discharged their firearms in response to being confronted by the male pointing a gun at them.
- The individual, Daniel James Wood, died as a result of his wounds.
