## Volunteer CPC Member Q & A

- 1. What requirements do I need to have completed to become a CPC voting member?
  - You must complete the Citizens Police Academy
  - You must be able to be able to pass an APD background check
- 2. What are the requirements once I become a CPC voting member?
  - Read and familiarize yourself with the CASA paragraphs regarding CPC's
     (http://www.cabq.gov/police/documents/first-amended-restates-cour-approved-settlement-agreement.pdf
     pages 85-86 para. 266-270)
  - You must attend no less than 10 of the monthly meetings
  - You may need to attend special meetings such as the Mayors Town Hall and CPC Summits.
- How much time should I expect to donate to being a member of an area CPC?
  - If you are a citizen member of the CPC, you will be spending approximately 2-4 hours per month on your CPC.
    - A Citizen member does not need to attend the CPA or background check, but can still attend meetings, have a voice and submit recommendations to the city.
  - If you are a voting member of the CPC, you will be spending approximately 10-12 hours per month on your CPC.
    - A Voting member must have attended the CPA and completed the background check. Voting members can still attend meetings, have a voice and submit recommendations to the city.
  - If you are a seat holder on your CPC, you will be spending approximately 15-30 hours per month on your CPC.
    - A Seat holder is on that area CPC board and has multiple responsibilities. These
      members must have attended the CPA and completed the background check.
      They also attend meetings, have a voice and submit recommendations to the
      city.
- 4. What is my financial responsibility?
  - At this time, there is no out of pocket expense to be a CPC member
