PARENTS:

- ⇒ Map out your route and be sure where you are going.
- ⇒ Accompany your young children and plan to go when it is light out.
- ⇒ Feed your children a meal or substantial snack before trick or treating.
- ⇒ Have children save a card until they get home.
- ⇒ Inspect all treats; Throw away unwrapped, open, or suspicious looking goodies.



AT HOME:


- ⇒ Put away anything children could trip over.
- ⇒ Turn the lights on and replace any burned-out bulbs at the walkway and front door.
- ⇒ Remember, Your Jack- O-Lantern and any other candles or electrical decorations can be a fire hazard. Keep them out of the reach of small children and away from flammable materials.
- ⇒ Never leave your house unattended. If you have to leave your house, make sure all the doors are locked.

TRICK—OR —TREATERS:

- Fake knives, Swords, Guns, and other costume accessories can potentially cause injuries. Make sure they aren't too long for the costume and review with your child that they are part of the costume and not a weapon.
- Costumes with light colors and/or reflective tape are best. Someone in the group should carry a flashlight. Consider putting reflective tape on their bags.
- Children should always trick or treat in groups preferably with adult supervision.
- Carry a cell phone for quick communication .
- Children should be instructed to stop only at familiar homes and where the outside lights are on.
- Never go into a home or car to collect a treats.
- Don't forget to Inspect fruit and homemade treats for anything that looks suspicious.
- Treats with open packaging or torn wrappers should be

How long have you been with the Albuquerque Police Department (APD)?

I have been employed at APD for about 4 years. There was a period between when I was hired and when I started the academy, and during that time I asked to be assigned to the Real Time Crime Center (RTCC). I wanted to learn more about their resources and databases, and working there gave me access to those resources after I graduated the police academy.

What do you like about working at APD?

Working at APD has given me a lot of opportunities to try different things, learn about areas of responsibility in policing, and get experience in a diverse set of skills. I'm very proud of my position with the Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) and being on that team means that I've also received certification as a negotiator. I most recently worked at the Eastside Impact Task Force as a Detective, and I enjoy the process of building a case and executing warrants.

How long have you worked Downtown?

I've done a lot of tactical plans in the Downtown area but I have only worked in the unit since August of this year. I am brand new to the unit.

Where did you grow up?

I was born and raised in Norway. I grew up in my mother's childhood town of Horten, where I did all my K-12 schooling. We traveled around some while my father was serving in the Navy, but ultimately that is where my parents wanted to settle down. I still go home from time to time to visit family and friends.

How long have you lived in Albuquerque?

I moved to Albuquerque for the job, so about four years now. I was living with my in-laws in Arizona when I got the job offer, so the move wasn't too bad. I had recently left the Army after serving for 7 years active, and moved here from Ft. Huachuca in Arizona.

Where did you go to school?

After I graduated from high school I came to the U.S. to attend the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, NY. I graduated with honors in 2010, and later earned a Master's in Criminal Justice from St. Ambrose University in Iowa, graduating in 2017.

What are your hobbies?

I love spending time with my family on my days off. I am also a long-distance runner, and have completed approximately 30 marathons and ultramarathons. I've finished a 100 mile race and also completed a marathon series of 7 marathons in 7 days. My last marathon was the 2021 Estes Park Marathon in Colorado.
