

This month Commander Jason Sanchez of the Internal Affairs Force Division (IAFD) will be telling us about the pilot program that's been running in our command area. The program addresses the necessary procedures for when a level one use of force takes place. Level one use of force is when there is only a brief amount of pain when people are taken into custody, often it refers to the pain of having handcuffs put on.


The purpose of the pilot is to explore cutting down on the necessary paperwork that officers involved have to do. It means that they can be back on patrol more expediently, thereby not decreasing the number of patrols out and about in our communities.

We will also be getting an update on the recent Independent Monitor's Report (IMR 16) and as always there'll be a chance to speak with Area Command to discuss whatever issues and concerns you may have.
