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DE-ESCALATION OFFICER OF THE MONTH FOR JULY 2025

SGT. ELISA VALDEZ



Congratulations, to Sgt. Elisa Valdez, she has been selected for the De-Escalation Officer of the Month for July 2025. She has been with the Albuquerque Police Department since August 2013 and is currently assigned to the Valley Area Command.

On February 20, 2025 the US Marshals Task Force requested assistance from the Downtown Swing shift Unit in apprehending a male subject with an active felony warrant for extradition to Alabama on charges of making terroristic threats. According to US Marshals officers, the suspect had issued dozens of telephonic threats to plant bombs at city buildings and police stations, allegedly in an effort to combat what he described as a tyrannical government. The male suspect, professionally trained in mixed martial arts, stood at 6'4" and weighed 255lbs.

Upon being taken into APD custody, the individual exhibited continuous physical and verbal aggression. He attempted to escape by damaging a marked patrol unit's door and repeatedly declared his willingness to end his own life to avoid imprisonment. Additionally, he detailed plans to disarm, mortally injure, and harm officers who tried to detain him.

Sergeant Elisa Valdez arrived on the scene and immediately succeeded in establishing a rapport with the suspect. She approached him with respect and dignity while remaining steadfast in her lawful duties. While the suspect displayed hostility toward nearly every other officer, he responded differently to Sergeant Valdez's calm and composed demeanor. Recognizing the need to safeguard both her team and the suspect, Sergeant Valdez went beyond the typical responsibilities of a field sergeant. She personally assisted in transporting the individual to MDC, demonstrating exceptional crisis intervention techniques throughout the process. Her steady communication and skilled approach ensured the safe transfer of custody from APD to MDC without incident.

Sergeant Valdez embodies the principle of "leading from the front" in every facet of her role as the Downtown Swing PRT Sergeant.

As for crime fighting, we recently announced our continued focus on resources in our city's Downtown area. Throughout the summer we are maintaining a zero tolerance policy to criminal activity.

Since the beginning of the year APD has arrested 26 juveniles Downtown and recovered 19 firearms.

- Robbery: 12.5%
- Sex Crimes 61.5%
- Burglary: 2.9%
- Auto Theft: 29.8%


The idea is simple: Build relationships and work with communities to address their concerns and priorities.

APD Community Policing comprises three key components: Problem Solving, Community Partnerships and Organizational Transformation.

Problem Solving: Solving problems means, first, identifying issues that need to be addressed and then determining resolutions and devoting effort to meeting needs for a successful outcome. The SARA (Scanning, Analysis, Response, and Assessment) model is one of the most familiar processes for problem-oriented policing (POP). APD is using this model.

Community Partnerships: Partnerships between law enforcement and the individuals and organization: they serve to develop solutions to problems and increase trust in police. APD will focus on creating partnerships with a diverse section of the Albuquerque community and will work with key community stakeholders including, but not limited to:

- Other law enforcement agencies
- Social service providers
- **Business community**
- **Educational institutes**
- Local prosecutors
- Faith-based organizations
- Neighborhood interest groups
- Youth organizations


