# HOW TO FILE A POLICE REPORT

⇒ Call: 242-COPS- (505) 242-2677
The Telephone Reporting Unit is responsible for reports where the suspects' identity is unknown as well as all minor crime reports that DO NOT require any field investigation by patrol officer. Crimes with no suspect information or evidence. DO NOT HANG UP, AS THIS WILL FURTHER DELAY YOUR CALL.

The following are examples of police reports that can be taken over the phone or online: Burglary, Auto


