## Mark Burton-Singing Arrow NA

- A rocket rally and pumpkin carving event held last month
- He is working on updating the draft CPC Ordinance
- Neighborhood Watch—it's now easy to create a neighborhood watch
- BCSO and neighborhood groups were not participating in a sting operation as alleged by a citizen

#### Vicki Williams-NE CPC Chair

- Oct is Domestic Violence (DV) awareness month. Forum to be held at the African American Performing Arts Center on October 26<sup>th</sup> from 11-2. There will be a panel discussion featuring Raul Torrez NM DA; Non-Profit Organizations will be there, New Mexico Crime Victims Reparation, SANE, Rape Crisis Center, FAC Organizations, APDs FAST Unit
- There 16,000 DV calls a year nationally which is 45 a day
- Every minute 20 people are victims of DV in the US

#### 5. Presentation –

- a. Amanda Thompson (Advocate, The Arc NM: sexual assault victim advocacy program for individuals with intellectual and development disabilities)
  - Grant received one year ago to work on domestic violence issues
  - 90% of people with disabilities end up being sexually assaulted
  - Epidemic in every neighborhood in America
  - Victims have no background on what is permissible and what is not
  - Society sees people with developmental disabilities as not credible due to their disability and the predators are aware of this fact
  - Her program is similar to the Rape Crisis Center programs

- b. Rosemary Traub (Metropolitan Court Domestic Violence Hearing Officer)
  - The community can help us by learning everything they can about domestic violence.
  - Victims say the best way to help them is to: Listen to them, believe them, do something.
  - Three Hearing Officers at District Court-there is no filing fee, the Hearing Officers review 25 to 30 cases a day and they have 8 to 10 hearings a day.
  - The two parties are the petitioner and the respondent. The petitioner usually does not have an attorney because they cannot afford one. But respondents usually have an attorney.
  - Victims typically make 5 to 7 attempts to leave their situation but financial and children are some of the reasons victims don't leave.
  - Risk of harm to the victim increases by 75% when they leave.

# Sgt. Josh Thoma (APD Stalking Unit Detective)

- He is part of Family Abuse and Stalking Team (FAST Unit)
- They deal with Domestic Violence Cases, not too many stalking cases
- Lots of stalking cases are actually harassment cases (misdemeanors)
- Calling 26 times or say "I see you at your vehicle" is not stalking, that is harassment
- Stalking is a felony
- Vehicle tracker technology has gotten cheaper and can be used to enforce retraining orders prosecute stalkers
