We look forward to closing out the summer on a positive note in the University Area Command. If you have not noticed University Area Command Proactive Response Team members are all now bike certified. We now have six (6) bike certified officers who have been riding throughout the Nob Hill Central corridor.

Officers throughout the city banded together to combat crime and misuse of public busses and bus stops. The mission resulted in multiple felony arrests for narcotics and other related crimes. Officers in the University Area Command will continue to work hard to prevent those who wish to misuse pubic busses and bus stops from doing so.

One note APD worked closely with UNM Police Department to capture two individuals near UNM Main Campus. Two males were walking in the area when they confronted another person on Central Ave and threated the male with a firearm. The victim fled the two males and called 911, UNM Police officers were in the area and responded and captured the two offenders. Both males were arrested for Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon and Conspiracy. This is an example of the great work UNM Police and APD are providing to those who live and work in the University Area Command.

Can You Answer the Call?

They are the voice on the phone on the worst day of your life, when you need help the most, they are the first, first responders. 911 Operators and Dispatchers answer the call every day. Operators gather crucial information and prioritize calls while keeping those in need calm and safe. Dispatchers manage calls, delegate officers and additional resources.

If you've always imagined a career that is rewarding, challenging and truly makes a difference – we ask, can you answer the call? The emergency communications team are professionals who make a difference every single day.

But what do they think?

"I'd like people to know that I remember them. That I meet them on their worst days. I meet them in panic and I hear their pain. Long after they forget the sound of my voice, I remember them."

Crime Reporting Services Available to the public:

File a Police Report Online

Are you the victim of a crime in Albuquerque? You might be able to report this crime to the Albuquerque Police Department online.

Report a Crime

We currently accept online reports for the following categories:

- Fraud
- Residential Burglary
- Auto Burglary
- Auto Vandalism
- Lost Property
- Telephone Harassment
- Theft or Larceny
- Vandalism

Telephone Reporting Unit

The Telephone Reporting Unit is responsible for reports where the suspect's identity is unknown as well as all minor crime reports that do not require any field investigation by patrol officers in the field.

The Telephone Reporting Unit (TRU) is staffed by civilian employees. Crimes with no suspect information or evidence (fingerprints, video, witnesses etc.) can be documented by the Telephone Reporting Unit.

Contact the Telephone Reporting Unit by calling 505-242-2677 or 505-242-COPS.

The following are examples of reports that can be taken over the telephone:

- Auto Burglary
- Commercial Burglary (delayed with no offender present)
- Residential Burglary (delayed with no offender present)
- Auto Theft (during TRU business hours)
- Larceny
- Lost Items (i.e. cell phones, purse)
- Vandalism/Graffiti
- Runaways/Missing Person (during TRU business hours)
- Harassment/Threats
- Embezzlement
- Fraud/Forgery
- Identity Theft
- Arson (if damage is below \$1,000.00)
- Vandalism
- Lost Items

If a Telephone Reporting Unit employee is unavailable <u>file an online report.</u>

Area Commands

The Albuquerque Police Department divides the city into seven geographical areas called area commands.

Each area command is managed by a commander and staffed with between 82 and 119 officers, depending on size of the area command and level of calls for service.

All officers are dispatched through the Police Communications operators by calling <u>505-242-COPS for non-emergency</u> calls or 911 in an emergency.

Police Substations

Police department employees are assigned to the substation to answer telephones and provide general information to walk-in visitors.

The following services are available at all substations from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday:

- File a report
- Request a copy of a report
- Report abandoned or disabled vehicles
- Comment on our service
- Contact us with any of your non-emergency needs

In addition, depending on the type of report you need, you may also be able to make the report over the telephone by calling **505-242-COPS**.


