The November meeting of the NWCPC Overview:

Our presentations started with a NW Area Command crime report from the Northwest Area Commander, David Saladin. Chief, Harold Medina was unable to attend but Deputy Chief Brown came to the presentation. The crime report was very much like last month good with decreases in the Northwest Command in all areas reported (residential and commercial burglaries and robberies, car thefts and vandalism) month to month and year to date compared to last year. The area command is still focusing on traffic issues and commercial burglaries and robberies. Shoplifting continues to be a challenge in all sectors of the city. The Northwest continues to lead the city in minimizing uses of force with 1/1000 interactions.

The remainder of our meeting was dedicated to training in Active Shooter Situations by Rob DeBuck. It was an amazing 75 minute presentation with real life examples and some really interesting videos of actual events. What would you do if someone walked into your church during services and started shooting? Learn some answers here!
