Discussion:	Lt. McElroy explained that the SOP was revised to align it with APD's current policy standards. He pointed out that several definitions were added to the policy. It was questioned how many CSSs APD has and where they are dispatched from. A question was asked about how the CSS would know the disposition of evidence since they do not attend court. Lt. McElroy confirmed CSSs do go to court and that it is in their process to look at the disposition of case(s). It was questioned which union represented CSSs. Lt. McElroy confirmed it was the Local 3022 M-Series. The Policy Manager added a comment in the draft to cite to Local 3022's collective bargaining agreement. Another question was asked about the type of training CSSs received.
