2. SOP	1-80 Prisoner Transport	Presented by: Greg Mondragon	
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Discussion:	 Mr. Mondragon explained that this policy was revamped six months ago and only one change was made, which was the removal of information about supervisors having the discretion to accept in-custody individuals without completed arrest documents because it is not feasible with the amount of traffic that goes through the Prisoner Transport Center (PTC). Question: Can medical staff at the PTC reject a prisoner? Answer: The medical staff will reject a prisoner if they do not meet the criteria to be transported to the Metropolitan Detention Center (MDC). Answer: Is there a form that could be developed that a prisoner can get on why they were rejected? Answer: PTC medical staff do give prisoners a form stating the reason why they were rejected.
