Message from the Commander

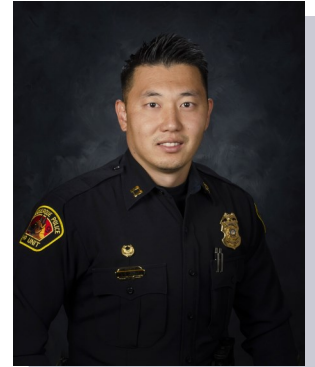

I am proud of the department's effort to reduce crime before and during the Balloon Fiesta. We saw a nice crime reduction compared to previous Balloon Fiestas, due to our warrant round-up operation and our crime reduction operations that were conducted during the Fiesta.

We continue to provide enforcement at our city parks, especially the parks next to our schools. I am pleased to report that I have numerous residents that have seen a difference in the crime, and a reduction with the unhoused population occupying the parks. Our next phase of our Quality of Life Initiative is also yielding some very positive results. It is this forensic evidence that can make the difference in identifying the offender and being able to prosecute them for the crime. Please report these crimes so our Crime Scene Specialists can process the scene/vehicle for this valuable forensic evidence.

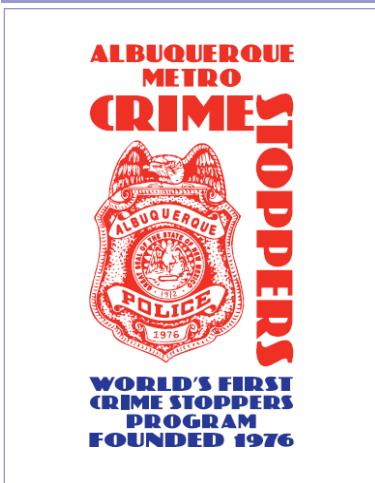

ABQ 311

Help me clean up graffiti in our community and download the "ABQ 311" App. It's easy, if you see graffiti in our community stop in a safe area and take a photo. Pin your location and give a brief description of what and where the graffiti is located so our city employees can easily respond for clean-up.

Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers is a community program that relies on anonymous tips to solve crimes and to locate fugitives from justice. Without anonymity of callers, the program cannot be effective.

Crime Stoppers pays rewards only for anonymous tips. Tipsters who identify themselves are not eligible for a reward.

Crime Stoppers has sole discretion to decide the amount of any reward to be paid, from zero to \$1,000.

Crime Stoppers will pay rewards only for tips given directly to it. Any tip given to another source, such as law enforcement, will not be eligible for a Crime Stoppers reward.

Crime Stoppers does not pay rewards to any person who has a legal duty to assist in the arrest of suspects and fugitives.

Felony Gun Crime + Arrest = Up to a \$1,000 CASH REWARD

Know someone who has used a gun to commit a crime, a felon in possession of a firearm or someone in possession of a stolen firearm?

Albuquerque Police Department App

The Albuquerque Police Department had numerous ways to report a crime or suspicious activity. 911 is the dedicated emergency line; an emergency is any time someone’s life, safety or property is *immediately* in danger.

If a police response is needed in a non-emergency, 242-COPS (2677) is the phone number to call.

But did you know, you can report incidents over the phone, online or via the APD App? The Telephone Reporting Unit is housed at the Emergency Communications Center and can be contacted at the non-emergency number. Online reports can be filed at <https://www.cabq.gov/police/file-a-police-report-online>

To download the Albuquerque Police Department App, search ABQ Police on Google Play or the App Store. The App should be used **ONLY** for non-emergencies. To report an incident:

Open the App & Select 'In-Progress Report'	Select the Category (only non-emergencies)	Enter the Details and Click Arrow to Submit (use phone's location or type location in details field)
Details – Like so...	Confirmation Text w/Reference #	Survey Text

October 2022 was a challenging month.

Little did we realize, the CABQ server had not been sending the usual reminders – *one week, one day, and one hour in advance* – about our meetings since August. As a result, many community members couldn't find their log-in link to join us by Zoom. We're working to fix that minor glitch. Our apologies.

Some of you might know that the CPCs have an "executive body" we refer to as the Council of Chairs (CoC), which was formally established in January 2020. The CoC conducted its first public "town hall" meeting on October 22nd by Zoom webinar. After some brief introductions and discussion about the CPCs' mission, the meeting's focus shifted to (a) community members' concerns, questions, & comments; and (b) status of pending CPC recommendations to APD, then brainstorming about others. Our initial focus is on drafting recommendations to improve APD's effectiveness while fostering greater safety for all our community. These will be in-depth evaluations of community issues & goals, followed by collaborative brainstorming about possible solutions, using proven business development methods.
