I am pleased that a good amount of our supervisors and officers have bid back and are returning for the upcoming year. However, it will be a benefit bringing in new supervisors and officers, who will be bringing new ideas and solutions to address crime and quality of life concerns.

Additionally, we are initiating a pilot program here in the Southeast Area Command, specifically focusing more resources, which include personnel, time, and operations, for the west side of the Area Command.

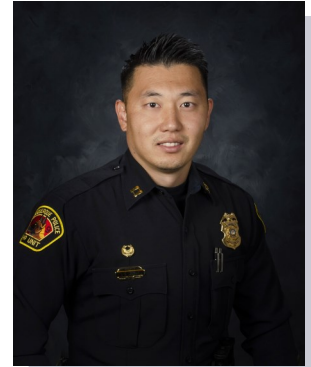
A Deputy Commander, two lieutenants, and four sergeants, are being assigned to focus on the west side of the Area command. I urge our community's residents and business owners, residing west of San Mateo Blvd to contact and meet our new Deputy Commander, Ray Del Greco, who is focused on crime reduction, improving response times, and increasing our high visibility patrol and presence.

Talking about response times, I am proud that your officers are working extremely hard, we have made significant progress with reducing the amount of time calls for service are holding for. Our response times to priority one, two, and three, calls for service are below the overall department response time averages.

We have seen an overall one hour decrease in our response times to calls for service. Supervisors are prioritizing what calls to respond too and officers are getting there quicker. As a department we will continue to prioritize and work on responding to calls for service quicker.

We have also had a great start this year with our community engagement efforts. Working with stakeholders, our faith based organizations, and our youth to identify issues of concern, and how our officers and the community can partner to address these issues and develop solutions.

I look forward to interacting with all of you at neighborhood association meetings, coalition meetings, and community events this year.

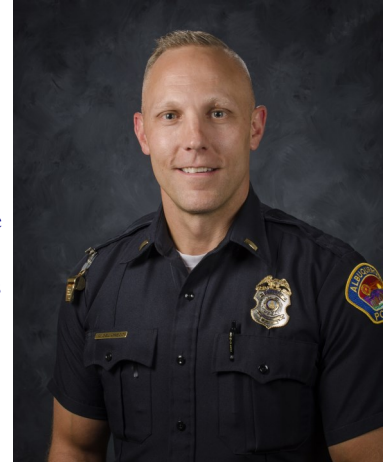

Meet the new Acting Deputy Commander of University Area Command

Hello, my name is Ray Del Greco I am the newly promoted Acting Deputy Commander for the University Area Command pilot project. Beginning in 2023, Mayor Keller and Chief Medina are conducting a pilot project in the Southeast Area Command. The proposed pilot project sets to split the Southeast Area Command into two sections. The University area consists of San Mateo to the East to I-25, I-40 North to the city limits to the South. Commander Languit will oversee both sections and I will focus on the University Area Command. Under Commander Languit’s leadership the University Area will focus on reducing call wait times, reduce crime rates, and engaging youth throughout the University area.

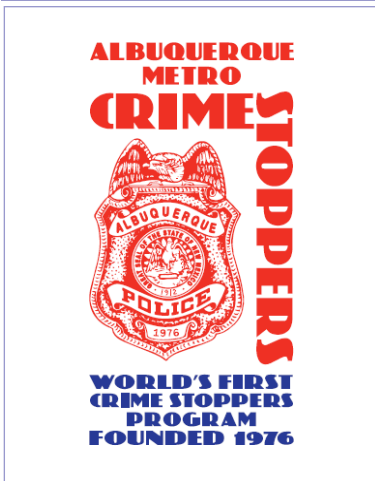

Help me clean up graffiti in our community and download the "ABQ 311" App. It's easy, if you see graffiti in our community stop in a safe area and take a photo. Pin your location and give a brief description of what and where the graffiti is located so our city employees can easily respond for clean-up.

Albuquerque Metro Crime Stoppers is a community program that relies on anonymous tips to solve crimes and to locate fugitives from justice. Without anonymity of callers, the program cannot be effective.

Crime Stoppers pays rewards only for anonymous tips. Tipsters who identify themselves are not eligible for a reward.

Crime Stoppers has sole discretion to decide the amount of any reward to be paid, from zero to \$1,000.

Crime Stoppers will pay rewards only for tips given directly to it. Any tip given to another source, such as law enforcement, will not be eligible for a Crime Stoppers reward.

Crime Stoppers does not pay rewards to any person who has a legal duty to assist in the arrest of suspects and fugitives.

Felony Gun Crime + Arrest = Up to a \$1,000 CASH REWARD

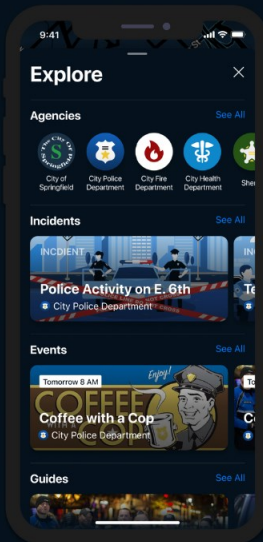
Atlas One APP



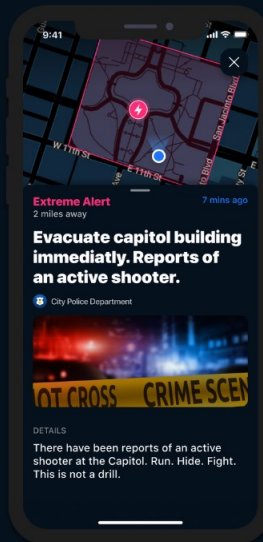

The Atlas One app will automatically send you an alert when a public safety issue occurs near your current location, or places you care about, such as your home, school, or office.

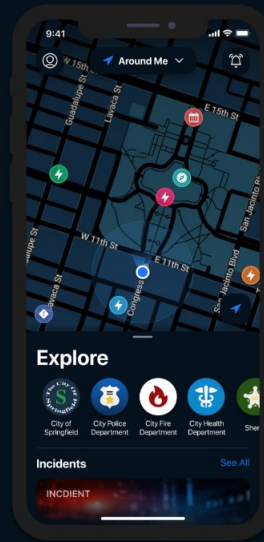

OUR ROLE

ACS is the newest part of the City’s public safety response system, and our team responds to 911 calls for mental health, substance use, and homelessness issues.

OUR DEPARTMENT

ACS began as a community-led initiative. Today, we are a cabinet-level department and the third branch of responders who are dedicated to transforming the city's approach to public safety.

OUR RESPONDERS

Mobile Crisis Team (MCT) Clinicians are independently licensed mental health professionals who work in a team with a uniformed law enforcement officer. MCT’s co-respond to high-acuity mental and behavioral health emergencies.

Behavioral Health Responders work in pairs and respond in person or by phone to requests for assistance with individuals experiencing issues with mental health, inebriation, homelessness, addiction, chronic mental illness that does not require a police, fire, or EMS response.

Community Responders provide support to community members in need of assistance related to inebriation, homelessness, addiction and mental health.

Street Outreach and Resource Responders provide street outreach in coordination with other City departments and community-based organizations to individuals experiencing homelessness in encampments and conduct in-person assessments.

Community-Oriented Response & Assistance (CORA) Responders work with victims, families and communities impacted by tragedy and violence
